6 7 Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 192.001, Florida Statutes, is amended, and subsections (20) through (22) are added to that section, to read:

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10 11 192.001 Definitions.— All definitions set out in chapters 1 and 200 that are applicable to this chapter are included herein. In addition, the following definitions shall apply in the imposition of ad valorem taxes:

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(2) "Assessed value of property" means an annual determination of:

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(a) The just or $\frac{\text{fair}}{\text{market}}$ market value of an item or property;

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(b) The value of property as limited by Art. VII of the State Constitution; or

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(c) The value of property in a classified use or at a
fractional value if the property is assessed solely on the basi
of character or use or at a specified percentage of its value
under Art. VII of the State Constitution.

- (20) "Fair market value" means the amount a buyer willing but not forced to buy would pay a seller willing but not forced to sell in an arm's length transaction.
- (21) "Just value" means the amount a buyer willing but not forced to buy would pay a seller willing but not forced to sell in an arm's length transaction with proper consideration given to each statutory factor, including any adjustments made to recorded selling prices or fair market value in determining the just value of property under s. 193.011. Just value is not synonymous with fair market value and all case law stating otherwise was expressly rejected by the Legislature with enactment of chapter 67-167, Laws of Florida. It is the further intent of the Legislature that any cases published since 1967 stating that just value is synonymous with fair market value are expressly rejected to the extent they are interpretative of legislative intent. This subsection is intended to clarify existing law and apply retroactively.
- (22) "Market value", as applied in Chapter 200, means "just value" as defined in this section.
