have not attained the age of 16 years, except as otherwise provided, are required to attend school regularly during the entire school term.

- 2.a. Children who will have attained the age of 5 years on or before September 1 of the school year are eligible for admission to public kindergartens during that school year under rules adopted by the district school board.
- b. A district school board or charter school governing board may adopt a policy that allows a child who has attained the age of 4 years on or before September 1 of the school year to be eligible for admission to public kindergarten during that school year. The policy must include, but is not limited to, a requirement that the child complete and pass the following assessments:
- (I) The kindergarten readiness assessment pursuant to s. 1002.69. The child must meet the minimum readiness rate adopted pursuant to s. 1002.69(6); and
- (II) A social assessment developed or selected by the school district or charter school. The child must meet the minimum readiness score identified in the district school board's or charter school governing board's policy.
