(c) Only in the event of a crash resulting in death or personal injury, a user's billing records for a wireless communications device or the testimony of or written statements from appropriate authorities receiving such messages may be admissible as evidence in any proceeding to determine whether a violation of paragraph (a) has been committed.

(4) (a) <u>A</u> Any person who violates paragraph (3) (a) commits a noncriminal traffic infraction, punishable as a nonmoving violation as provided in chapter 318. For a violation committed in a legally posted school zone or designated school crossing, the amount of the fine prescribed for the violation shall be doubled.

(b) <u>A Any</u> person who commits a second or subsequent violation of paragraph (3)(a) within 5 years after the date of a prior conviction for a violation of paragraph (3)(a) commits a noncriminal traffic infraction, punishable as a moving violation as provided in chapter 318. For a violation committed in a <u>legally posted school zone or designated school crossing,</u> <u>regardless of where the violation with respect to a prior</u>

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67 <u>conviction was committed</u>, the amount of the fine prescribed for68 the violation shall be doubled.
