If a student is convicted of, or is found to have committed, a felony 46 47 or a delinquent act that would have been a felony if committed by an adult, regardless of whether adjudication is withheld, the 48 49 student's participation in interscholastic extracurricular 50 activities is contingent upon established and published district school board or private school policy. 51
