Coach Mark Krikorian, began the 2014 season ranked 2nd by the
National Soccer Coaches Association of America, and

record of 16-1-1, the Seminoles defeated the 10th-ranked
Jniversity of Notre Dame Fighting Irish 3-1 and the 4th-ranked
Jniversity of Virginia Cavaliers 1-0 to win the school's second
consecutive Atlantic Coast Conference Women's Soccer
Championship, and
WHEREAS, following wins over the University of South
Alabama, Northeastern University, the 21st-ranked University of
Central Florida, and the 18th-ranked University of South
Carolina by a combined score of 14-0 in the 2014 National
Collegiate Athletic Association Women's Soccer Championship, the
Seminoles advanced to the semifinal round of the 2014 NCAA
Jomen's College Cup at Florida Atlantic University Stadium, and
WHEREAS, the Seminoles defeated the 3rd-ranked Stanford
Cardinal 2-0 in the semifinal round of the tournament, advancing
