Subsections (2) through (5) of section 514.031, Florida Statutes, are renumbered as subsections (3) through (6), 40 respectively, and a new subsection (2) is added to that section 41 42 to read: 43 514.031 Permit necessary to operate public swimming pool.-44 The department shall ensure through inspections that a (2) 45 public swimming pool with an operating permit continues to be 46 operated and maintained in compliance with rules adopted under 47 this section, the original approved plans and specifications or 48 variances, and the Florida Building Code adopted under chapter 49 553 applicable to public pools or public bathing places. The 50 department may adopt and enforce rules to implement this 51 subsection, including provisions for closing those pools and 52 bathing places not in compliance. For purposes of this
