Statutes, is amended to read:

373.703 Water production; general powers and duties.—In the performance of, and in conjunction with, its other powers and duties, the governing board of a water management district existing pursuant to this chapter:

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(9) May join with one or more other water management

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11 districts, counties, municipalities, special districts, publicly 12 owned or privately owned water utilities, multijurisdictional 13 water supply entities, regional water supply authorities, 14 private landowners, or self-suppliers for the purpose of 15 carrying out its powers, and may contract with such other 16 entities to finance acquisitions, construction, operation, and 17 maintenance, provided that such contracts are consistent with 18 the public interest. The contract may provide for contributions 19 to be made by each party to the contract for the division and 20 apportionment of the expenses of acquisitions, construction, 21 operation, and maintenance, and for the division and 22 apportionment of resulting benefits, services, and products. The 23 contracts may contain other covenants and agreements necessary 24 and appropriate to accomplish their purposes. 25 Section 24. Paragraph (b) of subsection (2), subsection

(3), and paragraph (b) of subsection (4) of section 373.705, Florida Statutes, are amended, and subsection (5) is added to that section, to read:

373.705 Water resource development; water supply development.-

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(2) It is the intent of the Legislature that:

32 (b) Water management districts take the lead in identifying 33 and implementing water resource development projects, and be 34 responsible for securing necessary funding for regionally 35 significant water resource development projects, including regionally significant projects that prevent or limit adverse 36 37 water resource impacts, avoid competition among water users, or 38 support the provision of new water supplies in order to meet a 39 minimum flow or minimum water level or to implement a recovery

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40	or prevention strategy or water reservation.
41	(3) (a) The water management districts shall fund and
42	implement water resource development as defined in s. 373.019.
43	The water management districts are encouraged to implement water
44	resource development as expeditiously as possible in areas
45	subject to regional water supply plans.
46	(b) Each governing board shall include in its annual budget
47	submittals required under this chapter:
48	1. The amount of funds for each project in the annual
49	funding plan developed pursuant to s. 373.536(6)(a)4.;
50	2. The total amount needed for the fiscal year to implement
51	water resource development projects, as prioritized in its
52	regional water supply plans; and
53	3. The amount of funds requested for each project submitted
54	for consideration for state funding pursuant to s. 403.0616.

56	(b) Water supply development projects that meet the
57	criteria in paragraph (a) and that meet one or more of the
58	following additional criteria shall be given first consideration
59	for state or water management district funding assistance:
60	1. The project brings about replacement of existing sources
61	in order to help implement a minimum flow or <u>minimum water</u>
62	level; or
63	2. The project implements reuse that assists in the
64	elimination of domestic wastewater ocean outfalls as provided in
65	s. 403.086(9) <u>; or</u>
66	3. The project reduces or eliminates the adverse effects of
67	competition between legal users and the natural system.
68	(5) The water management districts shall promote expanded

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69	cost-share criteria for additional conservation practices, such
70	as soil and moisture sensors and other irrigation improvements,
71	water-saving equipment and water-saving household fixtures, and
72	software technologies that can achieve verifiable water
73	conservation by providing water use information to utility
74	customers.
75	Section 25. Paragraph (f) of subsection (3), paragraph (a)
76	of subsection (6), and paragraph (e) of subsection (8) of
77	section 373.707, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
78	373.707 Alternative water supply development
79	(3) The primary roles of the water management districts in
80	water resource development as it relates to supporting
81	alternative water supply development are:
82	(f) The provision of technical and financial assistance to
83	local governments and publicly owned and privately owned water
84	utilities for alternative water supply projects and for self-
85	suppliers for alternative water supply projects to the extent
86	assistance for self-suppliers promotes the policies in paragraph
87	<u>(1)(f)</u> .
88	(6)(a) <u>If state</u> The statewide funds <u>are</u> provided <u>through</u>
89	specific appropriation for a priority project of the water
90	resources work program pursuant to s. 403.0616, or pursuant to
91	the Water Protection and Sustainability Program, such funds
92	serve to supplement existing water management district or basin
93	board funding for alternative water supply development
94	assistance and should not result in a reduction of such funding.
95	For each project identified in the annual funding plans prepared
96	pursuant to s. 373.536(6)(a)4. Therefore, the water management
97	districts shall include in the annual tentative and adopted



98 budget submittals required under this chapter the amount of 99 funds allocated for water resource development that supports 100 alternative water supply development and the funds allocated for 101 alternative water supply projects selected for inclusion in the 102 Water Protection and Sustainability Program. It shall be the 103 goal of each water management district and basin boards that the 104 combined funds allocated annually for these purposes be, at a 105 minimum, the equivalent of 100 percent of the state funding 106 provided to the water management district for alternative water 107 supply development. If this goal is not achieved, the water 108 management district shall provide in the budget submittal an 109 explanation of the reasons or constraints that prevent this goal 110 from being met, an explanation of how the goal will be met in 111 future years, and affirmation of match is required during the 112 budget review process as established under s. 373.536(5). The 113 Suwannee River Water Management District and the Northwest 114 Florida Water Management District shall not be required to meet 115 the match requirements of this paragraph; however, they shall 116 try to achieve the match requirement to the greatest extent practicable. 117

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(e) Applicants for projects that may receive funding assistance pursuant to the Water Protection and Sustainability Program shall, at a minimum, be required to pay 60 percent of the project's construction costs. The water management districts may, at their discretion, totally or partially waive this requirement for projects sponsored by:

125 <u>1.</u> Financially disadvantaged small local governments as 126 defined in former s. 403.885(5); or

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127	2. Water users for projects determined by a water
128	management district governing board to be in the public interest
129	pursuant to paragraph (1)(f), if the projects are not otherwise
130	financially feasible.

133	discretion, use ad valorem or federal revenues to assist a
134	project applicant in meeting the requirements of this paragraph.
