22	a felony involving a homicide, upon restoration of the person's
23	<u>civil rights;</u>
24	(2) If convicted of any felony not specified in paragraph
25	(1), upon the person's completion of sentence; or
26	(3) If adjudicated mentally incompetent, upon until
27	restoration of civil rights or removal of disability.
28	(b) No person may appear on the ballot for re-election to
