- a. Two health care practitioners, each of whom practices in a different area of medicine.
- <u>b.</u> Two representatives of organizations that represent health care practitioners.
- (b) The board shall review the surveys and research findings required by this section and make recommendations to increase the use and accessibility of services provided via

- (2) The Agency for Health Care Administration shall compile the surveys and research findings required by this section, along with the recommendations of the Telehealth Advisory Board, and submit a report of such findings to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by June 30, 2018.
- (3) The Department of Health shall survey all health care practitioners, as defined under s. 456.001, Florida Statutes, upon and as a condition of licensure renewal to compile the information required pursuant to this section. The Department of Health and the Office of Insurance Regulation shall submit their survey and research findings to the agency and shall assist the agency in compiling the information to prepare the report.
- (4) The Agency for Health Care Administration, the

 Department of Health, and the Office of Insurance Regulation may
 assess fines under ss. 408.813(2)(d), 456.072(2)(d), and
 624.310(5), Florida Statutes, respectively, against a health
 care facility, health maintenance organization, health care
 practitioner, and health insurer for failure to complete the
