1 2 An act relating to character-development instruction; 3 amending s. 1003.42, F.S.; requiring characterdevelopment programs to provide certain instruction to 4 5 students in grades 9-12; providing an effective date. 6 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 8 9 Section 1. Paragraph (s) of subsection (2) of section 1003.42, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 10 11 1003.42 Required instruction.-12 (2)Members of the instructional staff of the public 13 schools, subject to the rules of the State Board of Education and the district school board, shall teach efficiently and 14 faithfully, using the books and materials required that meet the 15 16 highest standards for professionalism and historic accuracy, 17 following the prescribed courses of study, and employing 18 approved methods of instruction, the following: 19 A character-development program in the elementary (s) schools, similar to Character First or Character Counts, which 20 21 is secular in nature. Beginning in school year 2004-2005, the 22 character-development program shall be required in kindergarten 23 through grade 12. Each district school board shall develop or 24 adopt a curriculum for the character-development program that 25 shall be submitted to the department for approval. The character-development curriculum shall stress the qualities of 26 Page 1 of 2

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27	patriotism; responsibility; citizenship; kindness; respect for
28	authority, life, liberty, and personal property; honesty;
29	charity; self-control; racial, ethnic, and religious tolerance;
30	and cooperation. The character-development curriculum for grades
31	9 through 12 shall, at a minimum, include instruction on
32	developing leadership skills, interpersonal skills, organization
33	skills, and research skills; creating a résumé; developing and
34	practicing the skills necessary for employment interviews;
35	conflict resolution, workplace ethics, and workplace law;
36	managing stress and expectations; and developing skills that
37	enable students to become more resilient and self-motivated.
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39	The State Board of Education is encouraged to adopt standards
40	and pursue assessment of the requirements of this subsection.
41	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2016.

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
