Section 379.107, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 18 19 379.107 Public records exemption; personal information.-As used in this section, the term: 20 (1) 21 (a) "Commercial entity" means a corporation, partnership, 22 limited partnership, proprietorship, sole proprietorship, firm, 23 enterprise, franchise, or association. "Personal information" means information that 24 (b) 25 identifies an individual, including, but not limited to, an 26 individual's photograph; social security number; driver license

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27 number; name; date of birth; address, exclusive of the fivedigit zip code; telephone number; e-mail or other electronic 28 29 communication address; and medical or disability information. 30 (2) Except as provided in subsection (3), personal 31 information held by the commission in connection with the following licenses, permits, and certifications issued by the 32 commission is confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 33 34 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution: 35 Recreational fishing, hunting, or use licenses and (a) 36 permits, or other noncommercial or nonprofessional licenses and 37 permits. 38 (b) Hunter safety certification. 39 (c) Boating safety certification or recreation record. 40 (3) Personal information may be disclosed only as follows: For use by a court, law enforcement agency, or other 41 (a) agency, as defined in s. 119.011(2), in carrying out its duties. 42 43 For use in connection with any civil, criminal, (b) 44 administrative, or arbitral proceeding in any federal, state, or 45 local court or agency presenting before a self-regulatory body, including the service of process, investigation in anticipation 46 47 of litigation, and the execution or enforcement of judgments and 48 orders, or pursuant to an order of a federal, state, or local 49 court. 50 (c) For use by a requester, if the requester demonstrates 51 it has obtained the written consent of the individual to whom 52 the information pertains.

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53 For use by a commercial entity for verification of the (d) 54 accuracy of personal information received by a commercial entity 55 in the normal course of its business, including identification or prevention of fraud or matching, verifying, or retrieving 56 57 information, which does not include the display or bulk sale of a legal residential address, date of birth, or telephone number 58 59 of a licenseholder to the public or the distribution of such 60 information to a customer that is not identifiable by the 61 commercial entity. 62 This exemption applies to personal information held by (4) 63 the commission before, on, or after July 1, 2016. 64 (5) This section is subject to the Open Government Sunset 65 Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed October 2, 2021, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through 66 67 reenactment by the Legislature. 68 Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public 69 necessity that personal information held by the Fish and 70 Wildlife Conservation Commission in connection with applications 71 for licenses, permits, or certifications for recreational, nonprofessional, or noncommercial activities be made 72 73 confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and 74 s. 24(a), Article I of the State Constitution. Under current 75 law, personal information held by the commission relating to 76 such licenses, permits, or certifications is a public record 77 available for any purpose. Such information can be obtained and 78 used to perpetrate identity theft and other invasive contacts.

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79	The public availability of this personal information needlessly
80	increases the risk of identity theft and invasive contacts with
81	those individuals who have a license, permit, or certification
82	issued by the commission. These unnecessary risks would be
83	diminished or eliminated if the commission preserved the
84	confidentiality of personal information held by the commission
85	relating to such licenses, permits, or certifications.
86	Therefore, the Legislature finds that it is a public necessity
87	to make confidential and exempt from public records requirements
88	personal information held by the commission relating to
89	licenses, permits, or certifications for recreational,
90	nonprofessional, or noncommercial activities.
91	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2016.

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
