Remove lines 16-39 and insert:

Section 1. Section 1004.096, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1004.096 College credit for military training and
 education courses.—The Board of Governors shall adopt
 regulations and the State Board of Education shall adopt rules
 that enable eligible servicemembers or honorably discharged
veterans ~~members~~ of the United States Armed Forces to earn
 academic college credit at public postsecondary educational
 institutions for college-level training and education acquired
 in the military. The regulations and rules shall include
 procedures for credential evaluation and the award of academic

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18 college credit, including, but not limited to, equivalency and
19 alignment of military coursework with appropriate college
20 courses, course descriptions, type and amount of college credit
21 that may be awarded, and transfer of credit.

22 Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 1007.27, Florida
23 Statutes, is amended to read:

24 1007.27 Articulated acceleration mechanisms.—

25 (2) The Department of Education shall annually identify
26 and publish the minimum scores, maximum credit, and course or
27 courses for which credit is to be awarded for each College Level
28 Examination Program (CLEP) subject examination, College Board
29 Advanced Placement Program examination, Advanced International
30 Certificate of Education examination, ~~and~~ International
31 Baccalaureate examination, Excelsior College subject
32 examination, Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education
33 Support (DANTES) subject standardized test, and Defense Language
34 Proficiency Test (DLPT). The department shall use student
35 performance data in subsequent postsecondary courses to
36 determine the appropriate examination scores and courses for
37 which credit is to be granted. Minimum scores may vary by
38 subject area based on available performance data. In addition,
39 the department shall identify such courses in the general
40 education core curriculum of each state university and Florida
41 College System institution.
