Section 101.622, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 18 19 101.622 Election alert system.-(1) The supervisor of elections shall establish an 20 21 election alert system consistent with this section. 2.2 The supervisor of elections shall, on the supervisor's (2) 23 Internet website or on the elector's voter registration form, 24 provide an elector with the ability to receive alerts. 25 (3) The alert system must provide electors with a text 26 message or an e-mail notification informing the elector that

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27 voting has begun. The message or e-mail must be sent by 11 a.m. on the first day of early voting and on election day, and it 28 29 must provide a link to precinct polling places and the hours the 30 precinct polling places are open. 31 Section 2. Subsection (1) of section 101.64, Florida 32 Statutes, is amended, and subsection (5) is added to that 33 section, to read: 34 101.64 Delivery of absentee ballots; envelopes; form.-35 (1)The supervisor shall enclose with each absentee ballot two envelopes: a secrecy envelope, into which the absent elector 36 37 shall enclose his or her marked ballot; and a mailing envelope 38 with a postage prepaid, preaddressed return envelope, into which 39 the absent elector shall then place the secrecy envelope, which 40 shall be addressed to the supervisor and also bear on the back side a certificate in substantially the following form: 41 42 Note: Please Read Instructions Carefully Before Marking Ballot and Completing Voter's Certificate. 43 VOTER'S CERTIFICATE 44 45 I, ..., do solemnly swear or affirm that I am a qualified and registered voter of County, Florida, and that I have 46 47 not and will not vote more than one ballot in this election. I 48 understand that if I commit or attempt to commit any fraud in connection with voting, vote a fraudulent ballot, or vote more 49 than once in an election, I can be convicted of a felony of the 50 third degree and fined up to \$5,000 and/or imprisoned for up to 51 52 5 years. Costs related to the postage prepaid, preaddressed 55 (5) 56 return envelope in subsection (1) shall be reimbursed to each 57 county by the Division of Elections upon request by the 58 supervisor of elections. 59 Section 3. Section 101.69, Florida Statutes, is amended to 60 read: 61 101.69 Voting in person; return of absentee ballot.-The 62 provisions of this code shall not be construed to prohibit any 63 elector from voting in person at the elector's precinct on the 64 day of an election or at an early voting site, notwithstanding 65 that the elector has requested an absentee ballot for that election. An elector who has returned a voted absentee ballot to 66 the supervisor, however, is deemed to have cast his or her 67 68 ballot and is not entitled to vote another ballot or to have a 69 provisional ballot counted by the county canvassing board. An 70 elector who has received an absentee ballot and has not returned 71 the voted ballot to the supervisor, but desires to vote in 72 person, may shall return the voted ballot, whether voted or not, 73 to the election board in the elector's precinct or to an early 74 voting site. The Department of State shall, by rule, allow the 75 elector to return an absentee ballot by hand delivery to the 76 elector's polling place on election day and allow the elector to 77 deposit the absentee ballot directly into the voting system The returned ballot shall be marked "canceled" by the board and 78 Page 3 of 4

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79 placed with other canceled ballots. However, if the elector does 80 not return the ballot and the election official:

(1) Confirms that the supervisor has received the elector's absentee ballot, the elector shall not be allowed to vote in person. If the elector maintains that he or she has not returned the absentee ballot or remains eligible to vote, the elector shall be provided a provisional ballot as provided in s. 101.048.

(2) Confirms that the supervisor has not received the elector's absentee ballot, the elector shall be allowed to vote in person as provided in this code. The elector's absentee ballot, if subsequently received, shall not be counted and shall remain in the mailing envelope, and the envelope shall be marked "Rejected as Illegal."
