A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Language Education Assistance Program; creating s. 1009.894, F.S.; establishing the Language Education Assistance Program within the Department of Education; requiring the program to provide grants up to a specified amount to certain participating institutions to provide free English classes to certain students; specifying student eligibility requirements; requiring students to maintain a specified grade point average to retain eligibility in the program; requiring a participating institution to report certain information to the department by specified dates; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, Florida has recently experienced a large influx of legal immigrants from Cuba and Puerto Rico, among other regions, and

WHEREAS, Florida's official language is English, and WHEREAS, Florida's society and economy will greatly benefit if these recent legal immigrants receive help in becoming proficient in English, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 1009.894, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

1009.894 Language Education Assistance Program. -

(1) The Language Education Assistance Program (LEAP) is established within the Department of Education and shall be administered pursuant to this section and the rules of the State

(2) LEAP shall assist recent legal immigrants to this state in learning English by awarding \$30 million in grants, as provided in the General Appropriations Act, to participating state universities, Florida College System institutions, or nonpublic colleges or universities to provide free English classes to students who meet all of the following requirements:

- (a) Must have arrived in this state within the preceding 3 years.
 - (b) Must have a low proficiency in English.
- (c) Must be a citizen or legal resident of the United States.
 - (d) Must be 18 years of age or older.
- (e) Must be accepted at a state university, a Florida

 College System institution, or a nonpublic college or university
 that participates in the program.
- (3) To retain program eligibility, a student must maintain a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale in all English classes taken at the institution.
- (4) A participating institution shall report passage rates and any other information requested by the department by January 15 and June 15 of each year to assess the success of the program.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2016.
