19	in all of the schools of the district, programs of a patriotic
20	nature to encourage greater respect for the government of the
21	United States and its national anthem and flag, subject always
22	to other existing pertinent laws of the United States or of the
23	state. When the national anthem is played, students and all
24	civilians shall stand at attention, men removing the headdress,
25	except when such headdress is worn for religious purposes. The
26	pledge of allegiance to the flag, "I pledge allegiance to the
27	flag of the United States of America and to the republic for
28	which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty
29	and justice for all," shall be rendered by students standing
30	with the right hand over the heart. The pledge of allegiance to
31	the flag shall be recited at the beginning of the day in each
32	public elementary, middle, and high school in the state. Each

33	student shall be informed by <u>a written notice published in the</u>
34	student handbook or a similar publication pursuant to s.
35	1006.07(2) posting a notice in a conspicuous place that the
36	student has the right not to participate in reciting the pledge.
37	Upon written request by his or her parent, the student must be
38	excused from reciting the pledge, including standing, placing
39	the right hand over his or her heart, and, if the student is
40	male, removing his headdress. When the pledge is given,
