An act relating to sexual offenses involving postsecondary students; creating s. 943.0431, F.S.; requiring that law enforcement agencies report certain sexual offenses involving postsecondary students to a designated official at the postsecondary institution; providing a definition; creating ss. 1005.11 and 1006.6951, F.S.; requiring specified postsecondary institutions to require that information on sexual assault be included in course syllabi; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 943.0431, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

943.0431 Reporting sexual offenses involving postsecondary students.—A law enforcement agency investigating an alleged sexual offense must, if both the alleged perpetrator and the victim of the offense are students at the same Florida College System institution, state university, or nonpublic college, university, or school, as defined in s. 1000.21 or s. 1005.02, at the time of the offense, report the offense to the Title IX coordinator of that institution within 10 days after the first report of the incident or within 10 days after learning of the student status of the alleged perpetrator and victim, whichever is later. For purposes of this section, the term "sexual offense" means a sexual offense, whether forcible or nonforcible, as such offenses are classified under the uniform crime reporting system of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
