16	WHEREAS, Florida has more than 1,500 public and private
17	golf course facilities, more than any other state, which
18	generate annual revenues of \$4.1 billion, a sum greater than
19	that of all other spectator sports in the state combined, and

21	championships in 2016, including six PGA TOUR events, four
22	Champions Tour events, two Web.com Tour events, and two LPGA
23	Tour events, and
24	WHEREAS, two of golf's most prestigious events are played
25	in Florida, THE PLAYERS Championship at TPC Sawgrass in Ponte
26	Vedra Beach and the World Golf Championships-Cadillac
27	Championship, played since 2007 at Trump National Doral in

29	WHEREAS, Florida's golf industry is a top contributor to
30	charitable organizations, with donations totaling more than
31	\$383.4 million annually from numerous golf outings and events,
