| 21 | (1) As used in this section, the term <u>"killing of a law</u>          |
| 22 | enforcement officer who was acting in accordance with his or her        |
| 23 | <u>official duties"</u>   |

| 29 | (2) A photograph or video or audio recording that depicts               |

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30 or records the killing of a law enforcement officer who was 31 acting in accordance with his or her official duties a person is 32 confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I 33 of the State Constitution, except that a surviving spouse of the 34 decedent may view and copy any such photograph or video 35 recording or listen to or copy any such audio recording. If 36 there is no surviving spouse, then the surviving parents shall 37 have access to such records. If there is no surviving spouse or 38 parent, then an adult child shall have access to such records.

39 (3) (a) The deceased's surviving relative, with whom 40 authority rests to obtain such records, may designate in writing 41 an agent to obtain such records.

42 (b) A local governmental entity, or a state or federal 43 agency, in furtherance of its official duties, pursuant to a 44 written request, may view or copy a photograph or video 45 recording or may listen to or copy an audio recording of the 46 killing of a law enforcement officer who was acting in 47 accordance with his or her official duties a person and, unless 48 otherwise required in the performance of their duties, the 49 identity of the deceased shall remain confidential and exempt.

(c) The custodian of the record, or his or her designee, may not permit any other person to view or copy such photograph or video recording or listen to or copy such audio recording without a court order.

(4) (a) The court, upon a showing of good cause, may issue
an order authorizing any person to view or copy a photograph or
video recording that depicts or records the killing of <u>a law</u>
<u>enforcement officer who was acting in accordance with his or her</u>
<u>official duties</u> <del>a person</del> or to listen to or copy an audio

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59 recording that depicts or records the killing of <u>a law</u> 60 <u>enforcement officer who was acting in accordance with his or her</u> 61 <u>official duties</u> <del>a person</del> and may prescribe any restrictions or 62 stipulations that the court deems appropriate.

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(b) In determining good cause, the court shall consider:

64 1. Whether such disclosure is necessary for the public65 evaluation of governmental performance;

2. The seriousness of the intrusion into the family's right
to privacy and whether such disclosure is the least intrusive
means available; and

69 3. The availability of similar information in other public70 records, regardless of form.

(c) In all cases, the viewing, copying, listening to, or other handling of a photograph or video or audio recording that depicts or records the killing of <u>a law enforcement officer who</u> <u>was acting in accordance with his or her official duties <del>a</del> <del>person</del> must be under the direct supervision of the custodian of the record or his or her designee.</u>

77 (5) A surviving spouse shall be given reasonable notice of 78 a petition filed with the court to view or copy a photograph or 79 video recording that depicts or records the killing of a law 80 enforcement officer who was acting in accordance with his or her 81 official duties a person or to listen to or copy any such audio 82 recording, a copy of such petition, and reasonable notice of the 83 opportunity to be present and heard at any hearing on the matter. If there is no surviving spouse, then such notice must 84 85 be given to the parents of the deceased and, if the deceased has 86 no living parent, then to the adult children of the deceased. 87 (6) (a) Any custodian of a photograph or video or audio

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88 recording that depicts or records the killing of <u>a law</u> 89 <u>enforcement officer who was acting in accordance with his or her</u> 90 <u>official duties</u> <del>a person</del> who willfully and knowingly violates 91 this section commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as 92 provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

(b) Any person who willfully and knowingly violates a court order issued pursuant to this section commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

97 (c) A criminal or administrative proceeding is exempt from this section but, unless otherwise exempted, is subject to all 98 other provisions of chapter 119, provided however that this 99 section does not prohibit a court in a criminal or 100 administrative proceeding upon good cause shown from restricting 101 or otherwise controlling the disclosure of a killing, crime 102 103 scene, or similar photograph or video or audio recordings in the 104 manner prescribed herein.

(7) This exemption shall be given retroactive application 105 106 and shall apply to all photographs or video or audio recordings that depict or record the killing of a law enforcement officer 107 who was acting in accordance with his or her official duties a 108 109 person, regardless of whether the killing of the person occurred 110 before, on, or after July 1, 2011. However, nothing herein is 111 intended to, nor may be construed to, overturn or abrogate or 112 alter any existing orders duly entered into by any court of this state, as of the effective date of this act, which restrict or 113 114 limit access to any photographs or video or audio recordings 115 that depict or record the killing of a law enforcement officer 116 who was acting in accordance with his or her official duties a
