3 and Motor Vehicles; amending s. 318.1215, F.S.;
4 revising the amount of a fee that a clerk of court may
5 be required to collect with each civil traffic
6 penalty; amending s. 320.02, F.S.; providing
7 exceptions to a requirement that the owner of a motor
8 vehicle notify the department of a change of address
9 within a specified time period; revising such time
10 period; amending ss. 322.051 and 322.21, F.S.;
11 providing for the issuance of identification cards at
12 no charge to certain persons in the custody or under
13 the supervision of the Department of Juvenile Justice;
14 requiring certain identification cards to be processed
15 by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor
16 Vehicles' mobile issuing units; amending s. 322.19,
17 F.S.; providing exceptions to a requirement that a
18 person obtain a replacement driver license reflecting
19 a change of name within a specified time period;
20 revising the time period for obtaining a replacement
21 license reflecting certain changes of information;
22 requiring certain persons to obtain a replacement
23 identification card reflecting a change of name within
24 a specified time period; amending s. 322.221, F.S.;
25 directing the department to issue an identification
26 card at no cost to a person whose driver license is

33 | Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

35 | Section 1. Section 318.1215, Florida Statutes, is amended
 36 | to read:

37 | 318.1215 Dori Slosberg Driver Education Safety Act.—
 38 | Notwithstanding ~~the provisions of~~ s. 318.121, a board of county
 39 | commissioners may require, by ordinance, that the clerk of the
 40 | court collect an additional \$7 ~~\$5~~ with each civil traffic
 41 | penalty, which shall be used to fund driver education programs
 42 | in public and nonpublic schools. The ordinance shall provide for
 43 | the board of county commissioners to administer the funds, which
 44 | shall be used for enhancement, and not replacement, of driver
 45 | education program funds. The funds shall be used for direct
 46 | educational expenses and shall not be used for administration.
 47 | Each driver education program receiving funds pursuant to this
 48 | section shall require that a minimum of 30 percent of a
 49 | student's time in the program be behind-the-wheel training. This
 50 | section may be cited as the "Dori Slosberg Driver Education
 51 | Safety Act."

54 320.02 Registration required; application for
55 registration; forms.—

56 (4) Except for a person subject to s. 775.21, s. 775.261,
57 s. 943.0435, s. 944.607, or s. 985.4815, the owner of any motor
58 vehicle registered in the state shall notify the department in
59 writing of any change of address within 30 ~~20~~ days after ~~of~~ such
60 change. The notification shall include the registration license
61 plate number, the vehicle identification number (VIN) or title
62 certificate number, year of vehicle make, and the owner's full
63 name.

64 Section 3. Subsection (9) of section 322.051, Florida
65 Statutes, is amended to read:

66 322.051 Identification cards.—

67 (9) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section or
68 s. 322.21 to the contrary, the department shall issue or renew a
69 card at no charge to a person who presents evidence satisfactory
70 to the department that he or she is homeless as defined in s.
71 414.0252(7), to a juvenile offender who is in the custody or
72 under the supervision of the Department of Juvenile Justice and
73 receiving services pursuant to s. 985.461, to an inmate
74 receiving a card issued pursuant to s. 944.605(7), or, if
75 necessary, to an inmate receiving a replacement card if the
76 department determines that he or she has a valid state
77 identification card. If the replacement state identification
78 card is scheduled to expire within 6 months, the department may



79 also issue a temporary permit valid for at least 6 months after
 80 the release date. The department's mobile issuing units shall
 81 process the identification cards for juvenile offenders and
 82 inmates at no charge, as provided by s. 944.605(7)(a) and (b).

83 Section 4. Subsections (1) and (2) of section 322.19,
 84 Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

85 322.19 Change of address or name.—

86 (1) Except as provided in s. 775.21, s. 775.261, s.
 87 943.0435, s. 944.607, or s. 985.4815, whenever any person, after
 88 applying for or receiving a driver license or identification
 89 card, changes his or her legal name, that person must within 30
 90 ~~10~~ days thereafter obtain a replacement license or card that
 91 reflects the change.

92 (2) If a ~~Whenever any~~ person, after applying for or
 93 receiving a driver license or identification card, changes the
 94 legal residence or mailing address in the application, ~~or~~
 95 license, or card, the person must, within 30 ~~10~~ calendar days
 96 after making the change, obtain a replacement license or card
 97 that reflects the change. A written request to the department
 98 must include the old and new addresses and the driver license or
 99 identification card number. Any person who has a valid, current
 100 student identification card issued by an educational institution
 101 in this state is presumed not to have changed his or her legal
 102 residence or mailing address. This subsection does not affect
 103 any person required to register a permanent or temporary address
 104 change pursuant to s. 775.13, s. 775.21, s. 775.25, or s.

106 Section 5. Paragraph (f) of subsection (1) of section
107 322.21, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

108 322.21 License fees; procedure for handling and collecting
109 fees.—

110 (1) Except as otherwise provided herein, the fee for:

111 (f) An original, renewal, or replacement identification
112 card issued pursuant to s. 322.051 is \$25, except that an
113 applicant who presents evidence satisfactory to the department
114 that he or she is homeless as defined in s. 414.0252(7); ~~or~~ his
115 or her annual income is at or below 100 percent of the federal
116 poverty level; or he or she is a juvenile offender who is in the
117 custody or under the supervision of the Department of Juvenile
118 Justice, is receiving services pursuant to s. 985.461, and whose
119 identification card is issued by any of the department's mobile
120 issuing units is exempt from such fee. Funds collected from fees
121 for original, renewal, or replacement identification cards shall
122 be distributed as follows:

123 1. For an original identification card issued pursuant to
124 s. 322.051, the fee shall be deposited into the General Revenue
125 Fund.

126 2. For a renewal identification card issued pursuant to s.
127 322.051, \$6 shall be deposited into the Highway Safety Operating
128 Trust Fund, and \$19 shall be deposited into the General Revenue
129 Fund.

130 3. For a replacement identification card issued pursuant



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131 to s. 322.051, \$9 shall be deposited into the Highway Safety
132 Operating Trust Fund, and \$16 shall be deposited into the
133 General Revenue Fund. Beginning July 1, 2015, or upon completion
134 of the transition of the driver license issuance services, if
135 the replacement identification card is issued by the tax
136 collector, the tax collector shall retain the \$9 that would
137 otherwise be deposited into the Highway Safety Operating Trust
138 Fund and the remaining revenues shall be deposited into the
139 General Revenue Fund.

140 Section 6. Subsection (3) of section 322.221, Florida
141 Statutes, is amended to read:

142 322.221 Department may require reexamination.—

143 (3) (a) Upon the conclusion of such examination or
144 reexamination the department shall take action as may be
145 appropriate and may suspend or revoke the license of such person
146 or permit him or her to retain such license, or may issue a
147 license subject to restrictions as permitted under s. 322.16.
148 Refusal or neglect of the licensee to submit to such examination
149 or reexamination shall be ground for suspension or revocation of
150 his or her license.

151 (b) If the department suspends or revokes the license of a
152 person due to his or her physical or mental condition, the
153 department shall issue an identification card to the person at
154 the time of the license suspension or revocation. The department
155 may not charge fees for the issuance of the identification card.

156 Section 7. Subsections (2) and (3) of section 765.521,



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157 Florida Statutes, are renumbered as subsections (3) and (4),
158 respectively, and a new subsection (2) is added to that section
159 to read:

160 765.521 Donations as part of driver license or
161 identification card process.—

162 (2) The department shall maintain an integrated link on
163 its website referring a visitor renewing a driver license or
164 conducting other business to the organ and tissue donor registry
165 operated under s. 765.5155.
