The 38 professional must have experience treating, teaching, or 39 assisting patients or clients who have been diagnosed with 40 autism or an autism spectrum disorder or related developmental 41 disability or must be certified in special education with a 42 concentration focused on persons with autism or an autism 43 spectrum disorder. (2) Each law enforcement agency must ensure that appropriate policies are developed which implement this section and that training is provided to its law enforcement and correctional officers based on those policies.
