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Section 21. Section 633.216, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

633.216 Inspection of buildings and equipment; orders; firesafety inspection training requirements; certification; disciplinary action; prohibited acts toward firesafety inspectors, firefighters, and fire officials; penalties.-The State Fire Marshal and her or his agents or persons authorized

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12 to enforce laws and rules of the State Fire Marshal shall, at 13 any reasonable hour, when the State Fire Marshal has reasonable cause to believe that a violation of this chapter or s. 509.215, 14 15 or a rule adopted thereunder, or a minimum firesafety code adopted by the State Fire Marshal or a local authority, may 16 17 exist, inspect any and all buildings and structures which are 18 subject to the requirements of this chapter or s. 509.215 and 19 rules adopted thereunder. The authority to inspect shall extend to all equipment, vehicles, and chemicals which are located on 20 or within the premises of any such building or structure. 21

22 (1) Each county, municipality, and special district that 23 has firesafety enforcement responsibilities shall employ or contract with a firesafety inspector. Except as provided in s. 633.312(2) and (3), the firesafety inspector must conduct all firesafety inspections that are required by law. The governing body of a county, municipality, or special district that has firesafety enforcement responsibilities may provide a schedule 29 of fees to pay only the costs of inspections conducted pursuant to this subsection and related administrative expenses. Two or more counties, municipalities, or special districts that have firesafety enforcement responsibilities may jointly employ or 32 33 contract with a firesafety inspector.

(2) Except as provided in s. 633.312(2), every firesafety 34 35 inspection conducted pursuant to state or local firesafety 36 requirements shall be by a person certified as having met the inspection training requirements set by the State Fire Marshal. 37 38 Such person shall meet the requirements of s. 633.412(1)-(4) s. 39 $633.412(1)(a)-(d)_{r}$ and:

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(a) Have satisfactorily completed the firesafety inspector

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41 certification examination as prescribed by division rule; and 42 (b)1. Have satisfactorily completed, as determined by 43 division rule, a firesafety inspector training program of at 44 least 200 hours established by the department and administered 45 by education or training providers approved by the department 46 for the purpose of providing basic certification training for 47 firesafety inspectors; or

2. Have received training in another state which is determined by the division to be at least equivalent to that required by the department for approved firesafety inspector education and training programs in this state.

(3) A firefighter certified pursuant to s. 633.408 may conduct firesafety inspections, under the supervision of a certified firesafety inspector, while on duty as a member of a fire department company conducting inservice firesafety inspections without being certified as a firesafety inspector, if such firefighter has satisfactorily completed an inservice fire department company inspector training program of at least 24 hours' duration as provided by rule of the department.

(4) Every firesafety inspector certificate is valid for a 60 period of 4 years from the date of issuance. Renewal of 61 62 certification is subject to the affected person's completing 63 proper application for renewal and meeting all of the 64 requirements for renewal as established under this chapter or by 65 rule adopted under this chapter, which must include completion 66 of at least 54 hours during the preceding 4-year period of 67 continuing education as required by the rule of the department or, in lieu thereof, successful passage of an examination as 68 established by the department. 69

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70 (5) A previously certified firesafety inspector whose 71 certification has lapsed for 8 years or more must repeat the 72 fire safety inspector training as specified by the division.

(6) The State Fire Marshal may deny, refuse to renew, suspend, or revoke the certificate of a firesafety inspector if the State Fire Marshal finds that any of the following grounds 76 exist:

77 (a) Any cause for which issuance of a certificate could 78 have been refused had it then existed and been known to the 79 division.

80 (b) Violation of this chapter or any rule or order of the 81 State Fire Marshal.

(c) Falsification of records relating to the certificate.

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(d) Failure to meet any of the renewal requirements.

(e) Making or filing a report or record that the certificateholder knows to be false, or knowingly inducing another to file a false report or record, or knowingly failing to file a report or record required by state or local law, or knowingly impeding or obstructing such filing, or knowingly inducing another person to impede or obstruct such filing.

90 (f) Failing to properly enforce applicable fire codes or permit requirements within this state which the 91 92 certificateholder knows are applicable by committing willful misconduct, gross negligence, gross misconduct, repeated 93 94 negligence, or negligence resulting in a significant danger to 95 life or property.

96 (g) Accepting labor, services, or materials at no charge or 97 at a noncompetitive rate from a person who performs work that is under the enforcement authority of the certificateholder and who 98

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99 is not an immediate family member of the certificateholder. For 100 the purpose of this paragraph, the term "immediate family 101 member" means a spouse, child, parent, sibling, grandparent, 102 aunt, uncle, or first cousin of the person or the person's 103 spouse or a person who resides in the primary residence of the 104 certificateholder.

105 (7) The division and the Florida Building Code 106 Administrators and Inspectors Board, established pursuant to s. 107 468.605, shall enter into a reciprocity agreement to facilitate joint recognition of continuing education recertification hours 109 for certificateholders licensed under s. 468.609 and firesafety inspectors certified under subsection (2).

(8) The State Fire Marshal shall develop by rule an advanced training and certification program for firesafety inspectors having fire code management responsibilities. The program must be consistent with the appropriate provisions of NFPA 1037, or similar standards adopted by the division, and establish minimum training, education, and experience levels for firesafety inspectors having fire code management responsibilities.

(9) The department shall provide by rule for the 120 certification of firesafety inspectors and fire code administrators.

(10) (a) A person may not influence a firesafety inspector by:

1. Threatening, coercing, tricking, persuading, interfering, or otherwise influencing, or attempting to threaten, coerce, trick, persuade, interfere, or otherwise influence, the firesafety inspector into violating any provision
