A bill to be entitled An act relating to child protection; amending s. 39.303, F.S.; revising the entities responsible for screening, employing, and terminating child protection team medical directors to include the Statewide Medical Director for Child Protection; requiring Children's Medical Services to convene a task force to develop a protocol for forensic interviewing of children suspected of having been abused; deleting provisions requiring certain entities to collaborate to ensure referrals and responses to certain child reports are appropriate; amending ss. 458.3175, 459.0066, and 827.03, F.S.; revising provisions regarding expert testimony provided by certain entities to include neglect, abandonment, dependency, and sexual abuse cases; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Subsections (1) and (8) of section 39.303, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

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39.303 Child protection teams; services; eligible cases.-

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(1) The Children's Medical Services Program in the Department of Health shall develop, maintain, and coordinate the services of one or more multidisciplinary child protection teams

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in each of the service districts of the Department of Children and Families. Such teams may be composed of appropriate representatives of school districts and appropriate health, mental health, social service, legal service, and law enforcement agencies. The Department of Health and the Department of Children and Families shall maintain an interagency agreement that establishes protocols for oversight and operations of child protection teams and sexual abuse treatment programs. The State Surgeon General and the Deputy Secretary for Children's Medical Services, in consultation with the Statewide Medical Director for Child Protection and the Secretary of Children and Families, shall maintain the responsibility for the screening, employment, and, if necessary, the termination of child protection team medical directors, at headquarters and in the 15 districts.

- (8) (a) Children's Medical Services shall convene a task force to develop a standardized protocol for forensic interviewing of children suspected of having been abused. The Department of Health shall provide staff to the task force as necessary. The task force shall include:
- 1. A representative from the Florida Prosecuting Attorneys Association.
- $\underline{\text{2. A representative from the Florida Psychological}}$  Association.
  - 3. The Statewide Medical Director for Child Protection.

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 $\underline{\text{4.}}$  A representative from the Florida Public Defender Association.

- 5. The executive director of the Statewide Guardian Ad Litem Office.
- 6. A representative from a community-based care lead agency.
  - 7. A representative from Children's Medical Services.
  - 8. Others designated by Children's Medical Services.
- (b) Children's Medical Services shall provide the standardized protocol to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by January 1, 2018.
- (c) Members of the task force are not entitled to per diem or other payment for service on the task force The Department of Health child protection team quality assurance program and the Family Safety Program Office of the Department of Children and Families shall collaborate to ensure referrals and responses to child abuse, abandonment, and neglect reports are appropriate. Each quality assurance program shall include a review of records in which there are no findings of abuse, abandonment, or neglect, and the findings of these reviews shall be included in each department's quality assurance reports.
- Section 2. Paragraph (c) of subsection (2) of section 458.3175, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
  - 458.3175 Expert witness certificate.-
    - (2) An expert witness certificate authorizes the physician

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to whom the certificate is issued to do only the following:

(c) Provide expert testimony in criminal child abuse, and neglect, abandonment, dependency, and sexual abuse cases in this state.

Section 3. Paragraph (c) of subsection (2) of section 459.0066, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

459.0066 Expert witness certificate.-

- (2) An expert witness certificate authorizes the physician to whom the certificate is issued to do only the following:
- (c) Provide expert testimony in criminal child abuse, and neglect, abandonment, dependency, and sexual abuse cases in this state.
- Section 4. Paragraph (d) of subsection (3) of section 827.03, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
- 827.03 Abuse, aggravated abuse, and neglect of a child; penalties.—
  - (3) EXPERT TESTIMONY.-

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- (d) The expert testimony requirements of this subsection apply only to criminal child abuse, neglect, abandonment, dependency, and sexual abuse cases in this state and not to family court or dependency court cases.
  - Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2017.

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
