Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development that <u>it</u> the

(3) The <u>Florida Sports Foundation shall operate under</u>
written contract with the department. The department shall enter
into a contract with the foundation by July 1, 2017. The
contract must provide Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic
Development shall contract with the organization and shall
include in the contract that:

(a) The <u>department</u> office may review the <u>foundation's</u>

The games shall be designed to 214 encourage the participation of athletes representing a broad 215 range of age groups, skill levels, and Florida communities. 216 Participants shall be residents of this state. Regional 217 competitions shall be held throughout the state, and the top 218 qualifiers in each sport shall proceed to the final competitions 219 to be held at a site in the state with the necessary facilities 220 and equipment for conducting the competitions.

(6) FLORIDA UNITED STATES OLYMPIC COMMITTEE LICENSE
 PLATES.-

236 Because the United States Olympic Committee has (a) 237 selected this state to participate in a combined fundraising 238 program that provides for one-half of all money raised through 239 volunteer giving to stay in this state and be administered by 240 the Florida Sports Foundation Enterprise Florida, Inc., to 241 support amateur sports, and because the United States Olympic 242 Committee and the Florida Sports Foundation Enterprise Florida, 243 Inc., are nonprofit organizations dedicated to providing 244 athletes with support and training and preparing athletes of all 245 ages and skill levels for sports competition, and because the 246 Florida Sports Foundation Enterprise Florida, Inc., assists in 247 the bidding for sports competitions that provide significant impact to the economy of this state, and because the Legislature 248 supports the efforts of the United States Olympic Committee and 249 250 the Florida Sports Foundation Enterprise Florida, Inc., the

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251 Legislature establishes a Florida United States Olympic 252 Committee license plate for the purpose of providing a 253 continuous funding source to support this worthwhile effort. 254 Florida United States Olympic Committee license plates must 255 contain the official United States Olympic Committee logo and 256 must bear a design and colors that are approved by the 257 department. The word "Florida" must be centered at the top of 258 the plate.

(9) FLORIDA PROFESSIONAL SPORTS TEAM LICENSE PLATES.-

(b) The license plate annual use fees are to be annuallydistributed as follows:

262 1. Fifty-five percent of the proceeds from the Florida 263 Professional Sports Team plate must be deposited into the 264 Professional Sports Development Trust Fund within the Department 265 of Economic Opportunity. These funds must be used solely to 266 attract and support major sports events in this state. As used 267 in this subparagraph, the term "major sports events" means, but 268 is not limited to, championship or all-star contests of Major 269 League Baseball, the National Basketball Association, the 270 National Football League, the National Hockey League, Major League Soccer, the men's and women's National Collegiate 271 272 Athletic Association championships Final Four basketball championship, or a horseracing or dogracing Breeders' Cup. All 273 274 funds must be used to support and promote major sporting events, 275 and the uses must be approved by the Department of Economic

277 The remaining proceeds of the Florida Professional 2. 278 Sports Team license plate must be allocated to the Florida 279 Sports Foundation Enterprise Florida, Inc. These funds must be 280 deposited into the Professional Sports Development Trust Fund 281 within the Department of Economic Opportunity. These funds must 282 be used by the Florida Sports Foundation Enterprise Florida, 283 Inc., to promote the economic development of the sports 284 industry; to distribute licensing and royalty fees to 285 participating professional sports teams; to promote education 286 programs in Florida schools that provide an awareness of the 287 benefits of physical activity and nutrition standards; to 288 partner with the Department of Education and the Department of 289 Health to develop a program that recognizes schools whose 290 students demonstrate excellent physical fitness or fitness 291 improvement; to institute a grant program for communities 292 bidding on minor sporting events that create an economic impact 293 for the state; to distribute funds to Florida-based charities 294 designated by the Florida Sports Foundation Enterprise Florida, 295 Inc., and the participating professional sports teams; and to 296 fulfill the sports promotion responsibilities of the Department 297 of Economic Opportunity.

3. <u>The Florida Sports Foundation</u> Enterprise Florida, Inc.,
 shall provide an annual financial audit in accordance with s.
 215.981 of its financial accounts and records by an independent

The National Association for Stock Car Auto Racing shall receive up to \$60,000 in proceeds from the annual use fees 338 339 to be used to pay startup costs, including costs incurred in 340 developing and issuing the plates. Thereafter, 10 percent of the 341 proceeds from the annual use fees shall be provided to the 342 association for the royalty rights for the use of its marks. The remaining proceeds from the annual use fees shall 343 3. 344 be distributed to the Florida Sports Foundation. The Florida 345 Sports Foundation Enterprise Florida, Inc. Enterprise Florida, 346 Inc., will retain 15 percent to support its regional grant program, attracting sporting events to Florida; 20 percent to 347 support the marketing of motorsports-related tourism in the 348 state; and 50 percent to be paid to the NASCAR Foundation, a s. 349 350 501(c)(3) charitable organization, to support Florida-based

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351 charitable organizations.

352 The Florida Sports Foundation Enterprise Florida, (C) 353 Inc., shall provide an annual financial audit in accordance with 354 s. 215.981 of its financial accounts and records by an 355 independent certified public accountant pursuant to the contract 356 established by the Department of Economic Opportunity. The 357 auditor shall submit the audit report to the Department of 358 Economic Opportunity for review and approval. If the audit report is approved, the Department of Economic Opportunity shall 359 360 certify the audit report to the Auditor General for review.

(64) FLORIDA TENNIS LICENSE PLATES.-

(b) The department shall distribute the annual use fees to the Florida Sports Foundation Enterprise Florida, Inc. The license plate annual use fees shall be annually allocated as follows:

366 1. Up to 5 percent of the proceeds from the annual use
367 fees may be used by <u>the Florida Sports Foundation</u> Enterprise
368 Florida, Inc., to administer the license plate program.

369 2. The United States Tennis Association Florida Section
370 Foundation shall receive the first \$60,000 in proceeds from the
371 annual use fees to reimburse it for startup costs,
372 administrative costs, and other costs it incurs in the

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The remaining proceeds shall be available for grants by the United States Tennis Association Florida Section Foundation to nonprofit organizations to operate youth tennis programs and adaptive tennis programs for special populations of all ages, and for building, renovating, and maintaining public tennis courts.
