16	Section 2. Paragraph (i) of subsection (6) of section					
17	339.175, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

19	(6) POWERS, DUTIES, AND RESPONSIBILITIESThe powers,					
20	privileges, and authority of an M.P.O. are those specified in					
21	this section or incorporated in an interlocal agreement					
22	authorized under s. 163.01. Each M.P.O. shall perform all acts					
23	required by federal or state laws or rules, now and subsequently					
24	applicable, which are necessary to qualify for federal aid. It

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30	(i) The Tampa Bay Area Regional Transportation Authority
31	Metropolitan Planning Organization Chairs Coordinating Committee
32	is created within the Tampa Bay Area Regional Transportation
33	Authority, composed of the M.P.O.'s serving Citrus, Hernando,
34	Hillsborough, Manatee, Pasco, Pinellas, Polk, and Sarasota
35	Counties. The authority shall provide administrative support and

54	statewide application designed to ensure the proper maintenance,

57	statewide mobility needs. Within the resources provided pursuant
58	to chapter 216, and as authorized under federal law, the
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    department shall:
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          (3) Develop and periodically update the rail system plan,
    on the basis of an analysis of statewide transportation needs.
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          (b) In recognition of the department's role in the
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    enhancement of the state's rail system to improve freight and
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    passenger mobility, the department shall:
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         1. Work closely with all affected communities along an
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    impacted freight rail corridor to identify and address
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    anticipated impacts associated with an increase in freight rail
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    traffic due to implementation of passenger rail.
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         2. In coordination with the affected local governments and
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    CSX Transportation, Inc., finalize all viable alternatives from
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    the department's Rail Traffic Evaluation Study to identify and
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    develop an alternative route for through freight rail traffic
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    moving through Central Florida, including the counties of Polk
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    and Hillsborough, which would address, to the extent
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    practicable, the effects of commuter rail.
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         3. Provide technical assistance to a coalition of local
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    governments in Central Florida, including the counties of
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    Brevard, Citrus, Hernando, Hillsborough, Lake, Marion, Orange,
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    Osceola, Pasco, Pinellas, Polk, Manatee, Sarasota, Seminole,
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    Sumter, and Volusia, and the municipalities within those
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    counties, to develop a regional rail system plan that addresses
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    passenger and freight opportunities in the region, is consistent
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    with the Florida Rail System Plan, and incorporates appropriate
    elements of the Tampa Bay Area Regional Authority Master Plan,
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    the Metroplan Orlando Regional Transit System Concept Plan,
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    including the SunRail project, and the Florida Department of
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    Transportation Alternate Rail Traffic Evaluation.
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Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2017.

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
