20          pawnbrokers, motor vehicle repair shops, sellers of  
21          travel, insurance representatives, and the carrying of  
22          concealed weapons or firearms; providing an effective

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25   Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 322.0511, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

322.0511 Veteran identification cards.—

(1) The department, in cooperation with the Department of Veterans' Affairs, shall create a veteran identification card to be used as proof of veteran status for the purpose of obtaining discounts or waivers offered to veterans for the exchange of goods and services and for other purposes authorized by law, except as provided in subsection (3). The veteran identification card must bear the colors and design approved by the department, including, but not limited to, a full-face photograph of the veteran and his or her full name, branch of service, and date of discharge. The words "Proof of veteran status" must appear at the bottom of the card.

(2) The department shall issue a veteran identification card by mail to a veteran of any branch of the United States Armed Forces who has been honorably discharged and who provides to the department:

(a) A copy of the veteran's DD Form 214 as issued by the United States Department of Defense.

(b) A copy of the veteran's valid, unexpired driver license or identification card as issued under this chapter or another form of photographic identification acceptable to the department.

51           (c) Payment of a \$10 fee, which shall be deposited into  
 52 the Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund.

53           (3) A veteran identification card issued pursuant to this  
 54 section is not considered an identification card for the  
 55 purposes of s. 295.17 or s. 322.051 and may not be used for the  
 56 determination of any federal benefit.

57           (4) A veteran identification card issued pursuant to this  
 58 section shall be terminated upon the death of the veteran.
