Between lines 702 and 703 insert:

(j) Meet the minority business enterprise procurement goals set forth in s. 287.042, in the procurement of commodities, contractual services, and other services and in the selection of vendors in the administration of activities under this section. The procurement goals must also be applied to veteran business

enterprises. The goal for participation of minority business enterprises, as that term is defined in s. 288.703(3), and of veteran business enterprises, as defined in s. 295.187(3), in MMTC operations and subcontracting is 10 percent; however, no more than 35 percent of such business enterprises may be owned by any one of the minority persons specified in s. 288.703 or by a veteran business enterprise, respectively.

- 1. This paragraph does not preclude a minority person or veteran business enterprise from competing for any MMTC registration or any other procurement of goods or services awarded by the department.
- 2. MMTCs have 12 months after the date of their registration to demonstrate to the department compliance with the minority business enterprise participation goal established in this paragraph.
- (k) Implement training programs and other educational programs to enable minority persons and veteran business enterprises to effectively compete for MMTC registration and contracts.
