16	Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (7) of section
17	509.032, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

19	(7) PREEMPTION AUTHORITY
20	(b)1. A local law, ordinance, or regulation may regulate
21	activities that arise when a property is used as a vacation
22	rental, provided such regulation applies uniformly to all
23	residential properties without regard to whether the property is
24	used as a vacation rental as defined in s. 509.242 or long-term
25	rental subject to the provisions of part II of chapter 83 or

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whether a property owner chooses not to rent the property.
However, a local law, ordinance, or regulation may not prohibit
vacation rentals or regulate the duration or frequency of rental
of vacation rentals.
2. A vacation rental owner, or his or her representative,
shall submit to the local jurisdiction a copy of the vacation
rental license required under chapter 509, a copy of the
certificate of registration required under s. 212.18, and
emergency contact information. The submission of such documents
and information is for informational purposes only. The local
jurisdiction may not assess a fee for the submission.
3. This paragraph does not apply to any local law,
ordinance, or regulation adopted on or before June 1, 2011 <u>,</u>
including any amendment to such law, ordinance, or regulation
that is less restrictive or that reduces the local regulatory
burden on vacation rentals owned, in whole or in part, by a
person who is currently serving on active duty or temporary duty
in a branch of the United States Armed Services or a disabled
veteran with a service-connected disability rating of 30 percent
or more according to the United States Department of Veterans
Affairs.
Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
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
