If a completed 38 39 voter registration application has been received by the book-40 closing deadline but the driver license number, the Florida identification card number, or the last four digits of the 41 42 social security number provided by the applicant cannot be verified, the applicant shall be notified that the number cannot 43 44 be verified and that the applicant must provide evidence to the supervisor sufficient to verify the authenticity of the 45 46 applicant's driver license number, Florida identification card 47 number, or last four digits of the social security number.
