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76 If a place of public accommodation does not conform to (C) 77 subchapter III of the Americans with Disabilities Act, the 78 certified expert must provide the owner with a remediation plan 79 to remedy the deficiencies. The certified expert shall provide a 80 reasonable amount of time, not to exceed 10 years, in which the 81 plan must be completed. The plan must include: 82 1. The date the place of public of accommodation was 83 inspected. 84 2. The name of the certified expert or other person who 85 inspected the place of public accommodation. 86 3. Identification of specific remedial measures that the 87 place of public accommodation will undertake. The anticipated date of initiation and completion for 88 4. 89 each remedial measure that the place of public accommodation has 90 agreed to undertake. 91 (d) In any action brought in this state alleging a 92 violation of Title III of the Americans with Disabilities Act, 93 42 U.S.C. s. 12182, the courts shall consider any remediation 94 plan filed by the place of public accommodation before the 95 filing of the plaintiff's complaint in determining if the 96 plaintiff's complaint was filed in good faith and if the 97 plaintiff is entitled to attorney fees and costs. (4) 98 The department shall develop and maintain a website, accessible to the public, which provides a list of all certified 99 100 experts and an electronic registry of certifications of
