17	WHEREAS, in 2017, an estimated 79,030 new cases of bladder
18	cancer will be diagnosed, and an estimated 16,870 people will
19	die from the disease, in the United States, and
20	WHEREAS, although bladder cancer can occur at any age, a
21	high percentage of people suffering from the disease are over
22	the age of 55, and
23	WHEREAS, even though bladder cancer is the fifth most
