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House Resolution

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Backpack Awareness Month" in the State of Florida.

A resolution recognizing August 2017 as "School

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WHEREAS, overloaded school backpacks are increasingly becoming a serious health risk for students across the nation, and

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WHEREAS, since spinal ligaments and muscles are not fully developed until after age 16, overloaded school backpacks are a source of repeated low-level stress that may result in chronic neck, shoulder, or back pain in children, and

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WHEREAS, according to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, more than 7,000 emergency room visits each year are due to school backpack-related injuries, and

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WHEREAS, in 2010 alone, physicians' offices, clinics, and hospital emergency rooms treated nearly 28,000 strains, sprains, dislocations, and fractures resulting from improperly worn or overloaded school backpacks, and

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WHEREAS, studies have shown heavy loads carried on the back have the potential to damage the soft tissues of the shoulder, causing microstructural damage to the nerves and damage to internal organs, and

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WHEREAS, studies have shown an increase in curvatures of the spine and compressed intervertebral height when a school backpack exceeds 10 percent of a child's body weight, and

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WHEREAS, the Global Burden of Disease Study of 2010 showed low back pain as the number one cause of disability worldwide, while musculoskeletal disorders were the second cause, and

WHEREAS, children's textbooks are much heavier now than many years ago, and in addition to textbooks, students often carry computers, cell phones, water bottles, running shoes, band instruments, and other equipment considered essential to have readily available, and

WHEREAS, more than 90 percent of students carry school backpacks, which, in studies, have been found to weigh as much as 25 percent of the child's body weight, and

WHEREAS, school backpacks are often not worn correctly, often slung over one shoulder or allowed to hang significantly below the waistline, increasing the weight on the shoulders and making the child lean forward when walking or stoop forward when standing to compensate for the extra weight, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That August 2017 is recognized as "School Backpack Awareness Month" in the State of Florida to promote awareness of the potentially serious and damaging long-term health effects of carrying overloaded or improperly worn school backpacks.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that school districts across the state are encouraged to educate students, parents, and their personnel, in collaboration with community-based organizations and parent-teacher associations, regarding the health risks of wearing an overloaded school backpack and the ways in which students may properly load and wear their school backpacks.

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
