- (a) Upon conviction of a violation of this subsection, any commercial harvester shall be punished as follows:
- 1. A first violation is a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable by a mandatory fine of \$5,000 and a term of imprisonment not exceeding 60 days. In addition, the commission shall suspend all of the violator's license privileges under this chapter for a period of 180 days.
- 2. A second violation is a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable by a mandatory fine of \$10,000 and a term of imprisonment not exceeding one year. In addition, the commission shall suspend all of the violator's license privileges under this chapter for a period of 12 months.
- 3. A third or subsequent violation is a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable by a mandatory fine of \$10,000 and a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of no less than 90 days, but not exceeding one year. In addition, the commission shall permanently revoke all of the violator's license privileges under this chapter.
- 4. During the period of suspension or revocation of license privileges imposed under this paragraph, the violator shall not participate in the taking or harvesting, or attempt

the taking or harvesting, of saltwater products from any vessel
within the waters of the state; be aboard any vessel on which a
commercial quantity of saltwater products is possessed through

- (b) Upon conviction of a violation of this subsection, any other person shall be punished as follows:
- 1. A first violation is a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable by a fine of up to \$5,000 and a term of imprisonment not to exceed 60 days. In addition, the commission shall suspend all of the violator's license privileges under this chapter for a period of 60 days.
- 2. A second violation is a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable by a fine of up to \$10,000 and a term of imprisonment not to exceed one year. In addition, the commission shall suspend all of the violator's license privileges under this chapter for a period of 12 months.
- 3. A third violation is a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable by a mandatory fine of no less than \$5,000, but not more than \$10,000, and a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of no less than 90 days, but not to exceed one year. In addition, the commission shall permanently revoke all of the violator's license privileges under this chapter.
