21	(1) Vendors shall be permitted to make deliveries away from
22	their places of business of sales actually made at the licensed
23	place of business; provided, telephone <u>, electronic,</u> or mail
24	orders received at \underline{a} vendor's licensed place of business shall
25	be construed as a sale actually made at the vendor's licensed
26	place of business.
27	(2) (a) Deliveries made by a manufacturer $or_{\overline{\tau}}$ distributor $_{\overline{\tau}}$
28	or vendor away from his or her place of business may be made
29	only in vehicles <u>that</u> which are owned or leased by the licensee.

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30	By acceptance of an alcoholic beverage license and the use of
31	such vehicles, the licensee agrees that such vehicle $\mathrm{\underline{is}}\ \mathrm{\underline{shall}}$
32	always be subject to be inspected and searched without a search
33	warrant, for the purpose of ascertaining that all provisions of
34	the alcoholic beverage laws are complied with, by authorized
35	employees of the division and also by sheriffs, deputy sheriffs,
