A bill to be entitled An act relating to small business financial assistance; creating s. 295.231, F.S.; creating the Veterans Employment Small Business Grant Program within the Department of Economic Opportunity; directing Florida Is For Veterans, Inc., to administer the program; defining terms; authorizing the corporation to accept and administer moneys appropriated for such grants; specifying grant amounts; limiting the amount that a small business may receive under the program; requiring a small business to apply to and enter into an agreement with the corporation to receive grants; prescribing minimum criteria for such agreements; requiring the corporation to notify the appropriate regional small business development center of a small business' participation; requiring the department to adopt certain rules; prescribing reporting requirements; providing for termination of the program; providing appropriations; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 295.231, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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295.231 Veterans Employment Small Business Grant Program.—
The Veterans Employment Small Business Grant Program is created
within the Department of Economic Opportunity to be administered
by Florida Is For Veterans, Inc. The purpose of the program is

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to stimulate investment in the state's economy by providing grants to small businesses that hire and employ honorably discharged veterans or disabled veterans with service-connected disabilities.

- (1) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Corporation" means Florida Is For Veterans, Inc.
- (b) "Small business" means an independently owned and operated, for-profit, privately held business that employs 50 or fewer persons; generates \$1 million or less in annual revenue; and has maintained its principal place of business in this state for at least the previous 4 calendar years.
- (2) The corporation may accept and administer moneys appropriated to the department for transfer to the corporation to provide grants to encourage small businesses in this state to hire and employ veterans.
- (3) A small business that hires a veteran as a new employee may receive a one-time grant of:
- (a) Fifteen hundred dollars for each newly hired veteran, as defined in s. 1.01(14).
- (b) Three thousand dollars for each newly hired disabled veteran, as that term is described in s. 295.07(1)(a).
- (4) The total dollar amount of grants awarded to a participating small business under subsection (3) may not exceed \$10,500 per fiscal year.
- (5) A small business must apply to, and enter into an agreement with, the corporation in order to participate in the program. The agreement must require that the small business:
- (a) Hire and employ for at least 1 year a qualifying veteran before becoming eligible for a grant awarded under

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subsection (3).

(b) Report information regarding the employment status of each qualifying veteran, if requested to do so by the corporation.

- (c) Pay each qualifying veteran an amount equal to at least 90 percent of the annual median income for veterans in this state at the time of hire, based on the most recent American Community Survey 1-year estimates published by the United States Census Bureau.
- (d) Use any awarded grant moneys to facilitate the creation of additional jobs for and employment of veterans by the small business; however, grant moneys may be used only for manufacturing, equipment, and facility expenses or other operating costs or fixed capital outlay projects.
- (e) Not receive any additional grant for rehiring a veteran who it previously claimed as an employee for purposes of obtaining funds under the program.
- (f) Is eligible to receive a grant award only for a veteran initially hired on or after July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2023.
- (6) The corporation shall notify the regional small business development center that serves the county in which a participating small business is located of the participation of the small business in the grant program in order to facilitate improved access to the resources of the Florida Small Business Development Center Network.
- (7) The Department of Economic Opportunity shall adopt rules to implement and administer this section which specify requirements for the application and approval process and the documentation necessary to claim grant moneys awarded under this

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section.

(8) By each December 31 for the duration of the grant program, the corporation shall provide an annual report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives on the grant program's progress and outcomes for the preceding fiscal year. The report must include the following:

- (a) An accounting of how the corporation used the state funds it received for the grant program.
 - (b) The number of small businesses receiving grant funds.
- (c) The number of veterans and disabled veterans employed by each small business receiving grant funds.
 - (d) The salary paid to each veteran employed.
- (e) The length of time for which the small business employed each veteran.
- (f) The grant program's economic benefit to the state and the performance-based metrics and methodologies used to calculate the grant program's economic benefit to the state.
 - (9) The grant program terminates October 1, 2024.

Section 2. Beginning July 1, 2018, and for the 2018-2019 through the 2022-2023 fiscal years, the sum of \$500,000 in nonrecurring funds from the State Economic Enhancement and Development Trust Fund is appropriated to the Department of Economic Opportunity for transfer to Florida Is For Veterans, Inc., to contract with the Department of Economic Opportunity to implement and administer the Veterans Employment Small Business Grant Program. The corporation may award grant moneys up to a maximum of \$500,000 per fiscal year. The corporation may spend up to \$25,000 per fiscal year of funds transferred by the

If any 119 appropriated funds remain upon termination of the program, Florida Is For Veterans, Inc., shall transfer those funds to the 120 121 Department of Economic Opportunity for deposit in the State 122 Economic Enhancement and Development Trust Fund. 123 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2018.

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
