Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 1002.89, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1002.89 School readiness program; funding.-

- (1) Funding for the school readiness program shall be allocated among the early learning coalitions in accordance with a formula developed by the Office of Early Learning.
- (a) The office shall develop a formula that meets all of the following requirements:
 - 1. Is equity-based.
 - 2. Considers all of the following:
 - a. The current and future growth of each county;
- b. The overall demographics of children who are 5 years of age or younger and those who are school-aged in each respective county, with greater weight given to the 5 years of age or

- c. The percentage of mandated referrals;
- d. The number of eligible children 5 years of age or younger whose households are at or below 150 percent of the federal poverty level;
- e. The current average market rate being paid by each county or early learning coalition; and
- <u>f. Other pertinent information as necessary to establish</u> statewide equity.
- 3. Is designed to maximize the enrollment of children 5 years of age or younger statewide.
- (b) By January 31, 2019, the office must submit the funding formula to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives for review. The formula must be implemented by July 1, 2020, and must be reviewed and updated as necessary, but at least every 2 years, to ensure ongoing equity. The office may adjust coalition allocations during each fiscal year, as needed, to maximize the enrollment of children 5 years of age or younger and to address funding fluctuations this section and the General Appropriations Act.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2018.
