(3) COLLEGIATE LICENSE PLATES.-

261 The department shall develop a collegiate license (a) 262 plate as provided in this section for state and independent 263 universities domiciled in this state. (a) The department shall develop a Live the Dream license plate as provided in this section. Live the Dream license plates must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The proceeds of the annual use fee shall be 318 (b) 319 distributed to the Dream Foundation, Inc., to The Dream 320 Foundation, Inc., shall retain the first \$60,000 in proceeds 321 from the annual use fees as reimbursement for administrative 322 costs, startup costs, and costs incurred in the approval 323 process.
