The appropriate board shall require each person 18 licensed or certified under chapter 458, chapter 459, part I of 19 chapter 464, chapter 466, chapter 467, chapter 490, or chapter 491 to complete a 2-hour continuing education course, approved 20 21 by the board, on domestic violence, as defined in s. 741.28, on human trafficking, as defined in s. 787.06(2), as part of a 22 23 every third biennial relicensure or recertification. The course 24 shall consist of information on the number of patients in that 25 professional's practice who are likely to be victims of domestic Page 1 of 3

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26 violence and the number who are likely to be perpetrators of 27 domestic violence, screening procedures for determining whether 28 a patient has any history of being either a victim or a 29 perpetrator of domestic violence, and instruction on how to 30 provide such patients with information on, or how to refer such patients to, resources in the local community, such as domestic 31 32 violence centers and other advocacy groups, that provide legal 33 aid, shelter, victim counseling, batterer counseling, or child protection services. 34 35 2. The course must consist of data and information on the 36 types of human trafficking, such as labor and sex, and the 37 extent of human trafficking; factors that place a person at 38 greater risk for being a victim of human trafficking; public and 39 private social services available for rescue, food, clothing, and shelter referrals; hotlines for reporting human trafficking 40 41 maintained by the National Human Trafficking Resource Center and 42 the United States Department of Homeland Security; validated 43 assessment tools for identifying human trafficking victims and 44 general indicators that a person may be a victim of human 45 trafficking; procedures for sharing information related to human 46 trafficking with a patient; and referral options for legal and 47 social services. Each such licensee or certificateholder shall submit 48 (b) confirmation of having completed the continuing education such 49

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course, on a form provided by the board, or through electronic

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51 <u>transmission for relicensure or recertification</u> when submitting 52 fees for every third biennial renewal.

53 The board may approve additional equivalent courses (C) 54 that may be used to satisfy the requirements of paragraph (a). 55 Each licensing board that requires a licensee to complete a 56 continuing an educational course pursuant to this subsection may 57 include the hour required for completion of the course in the 58 total hours of continuing education required by law for the such 59 profession unless the continuing education requirements for such 60 profession consist of fewer than 30 hours biennially.

61 (d) Any person holding two or more licenses subject to the 62 provisions of this subsection shall be permitted to show proof 63 of <u>completion of having taken</u> one board-approved course on <u>human</u> 64 <u>trafficking domestic violence</u>, for purposes of relicensure or 65 recertification for additional licenses.

(e) Failure to comply with the requirements of this subsection shall constitute grounds for disciplinary action under each respective practice act and under s. 456.072(1)(k). In addition to discipline by the board, the licensee shall be required to complete <u>the board-approved</u> such course <u>under this</u> <u>subsection</u>.

(2) Each board may adopt rules to carry out the provisionsof this section.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2018.

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
