13	Section 1. Section 499.029, Florida Statutes, is amended												
14	to read:												
15	499.029 <u>Prescription</u> Cancer Drug Donation Program												
16	(1) This section may be cited as the " <u>Prescription</u> <del>Cancer</del>												
17	Drug Donation Program Act."												
18	(2) There is created a <u>Prescription</u> Cancer Drug Donation												
19	Program within the department for the purpose of authorizing and												
20	facilitating the donation of <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs and												
21	supplies to eligible patients.												
22	(3) As used in this section:												
23	(a) "Cancer drug" means a prescription drug that has been												
24	approved under s. 505 of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic												
25	Act and is used to treat cancer or its side effects or is used												
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to treat the side effects of a prescription drug used to treat cancer or its side effects. <u>The term</u> "Cancer drug" does not include a substance listed in Schedule II, Schedule III, Schedule IV, or Schedule V of s. 893.03.

30 (b) "Closed drug delivery system" means a system in which 31 the actual control of the unit-dose medication package is 32 maintained by the facility rather than by the individual 33 patient.

34 "Donor" means a patient or patient representative who (C) 35 donates prescription cancer drugs or supplies needed to 36 administer prescription cancer drugs that have been maintained 37 within a closed drug delivery system; health care facilities, 38 nursing home facilities homes, hospices, or hospitals with 39 closed drug delivery systems; or pharmacies, drug manufacturers, medical device manufacturers or suppliers, or wholesalers of 40 drugs or supplies, in accordance with this section. The term 41 42 "Donor" includes a physician licensed under chapter 458 or 43 chapter 459 who receives prescription cancer drugs or supplies 44 directly from a drug manufacturer, wholesale distributor, or 45 pharmacy.

(d) "Eligible patient" means a person who the department
determines is eligible to receive <u>prescription</u> <del>cancer</del> drugs from
the program.

49 (e) "Participant facility" means a <u>hospital that operates</u>
 50 <u>a class II institutional hospital pharmacy or a nursing home</u>

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51 <u>facility licensed under part II of chapter 400 with a closed</u> 52 <u>drug delivery system</u> that has elected to participate in the 53 program and that accepts donated <u>prescription</u> <del>cancer</del> drugs and 54 supplies under the rules adopted by the department for the 55 program.

(f) "Prescribing practitioner" means a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459 or any other medical professional with authority under state law to prescribe <u>prescription drugs</u> cancer medication.

60 (g) "Prescription drug" has the same meaning as provided 61 in s. 499.003, and includes cancer drugs.

62 (h) (g) "Program" means the <u>Prescription</u> Cancer Drug
 63 Donation Program created by this section.

64 <u>(i) (h)</u> "Supplies" means any supplies used in the
 65 administration of a <u>prescription</u> cancer drug.

66 Any donor may donate prescription cancer drugs or (4) 67 supplies to a participant facility that elects to participate in the program and meets criteria established by the department for 68 69 such participation. Prescription Cancer drugs or supplies may 70 not be donated to a specific cancer patient, and donated drugs 71 or supplies may not be resold by the program. Prescription 72 Cancer drugs billed to and paid for by Medicaid in long-term care facilities that are eligible for return to stock under 73 federal Medicaid regulations shall be credited to Medicaid and 74 are not eligible for donation under the program. A participant 75

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76 facility may provide dispensing and consulting services to 77 individuals who are not patients of the hospital <u>or nursing home</u> 78 <u>facility</u>.

(5) The <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs or supplies donated to the program may be prescribed only by a prescribing practitioner for use by an eligible patient and may be dispensed only by a pharmacist.

(6) (a) A prescription cancer drug may only be accepted or dispensed under the program if the drug is in its original, unopened, sealed container, or in a tamper-evident unit-dose packaging, except that a prescription cancer drug packaged in single-unit doses may be accepted and dispensed if the outside packaging is opened but the single-unit-dose packaging is unopened with tamper-resistant packaging intact.

90 (b) A <u>prescription</u> cancer drug may not be accepted or 91 dispensed under the program if the drug bears an expiration date 92 that is less than 6 months after the date the drug was donated 93 or if the drug appears to have been tampered with or mislabeled 94 as determined in paragraph (c).

95 (c) Prior to being dispensed to an eligible patient, the 96 <u>prescription</u> cancer drug or supplies donated under the program 97 shall be inspected by a pharmacist to determine that the drug 98 and supplies do not appear to have been tampered with or 99 mislabeled.

(d) A dispenser of donated prescription cancer drugs or

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101 supplies may not submit a claim or otherwise seek reimbursement 102 from any public or private third-party payor for donated 103 <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs or supplies dispensed to any patient 104 under the program, and a public or private third-party payor is 105 not required to provide reimbursement to a dispenser for donated 106 <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs or supplies dispensed to any patient 107 under the program.

(7) (a) A donation of <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs or supplies shall be made only at a participant facility. A participant facility may decline to accept a donation. A participant facility that accepts donated <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs or supplies under the program shall comply with all applicable provisions of state and federal law relating to the storage and dispensing of the donated <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs or supplies.

(b) A participant facility that voluntarily takes part in the program may charge a handling fee sufficient to cover the cost of preparation and dispensing of <u>prescription</u> <del>cancer</del> drugs or supplies under the program. The fee shall be established in rules adopted by the department.

(8) The department, upon the recommendation of the Board
of Pharmacy, shall adopt rules to carry out the provisions of
this section. Initial rules under this section shall be adopted
no later than 90 days after the effective date of this act. The
rules shall include, but not be limited to:

(a) Eligibility criteria, including a method to determine

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126 priority of eligible patients under the program.

(b) Standards and procedures for participant facilities
that accept, store, distribute, or dispense donated <u>prescription</u>
cancer drugs or supplies.

(c) Necessary forms for administration of the program,
including, but not limited to, forms for use by entities that
donate, accept, distribute, or dispense prescription cancer
drugs or supplies under the program.

(d) The maximum handling fee that may be charged by a
participant facility that accepts and distributes or dispenses
donated prescription cancer drugs or supplies.

(e) Categories of <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs and supplies
that the program will accept for dispensing; however, the
department may exclude any drug based on its therapeutic
effectiveness or high potential for abuse or diversion.

(f) Maintenance and distribution of the participantfacility registry established in subsection (10).

143 A person who is eligible to receive prescription (9) 144 cancer drugs or supplies under the state Medicaid program or under any other prescription drug program funded in whole or in 145 146 part by the state, by any other prescription drug program funded in whole or in part by the Federal Government, or by any other 147 prescription drug program offered by a third-party insurer, 148 unless benefits have been exhausted, or a certain prescription 149 cancer drug or supply is not covered by the prescription drug 150

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151 program, is ineligible to participate in the program created 152 under this section.

153 (10) The department shall establish and maintain a 154 participant facility registry for the program. The participant 155 facility registry shall include the participant facility's name, 156 address, and telephone number. The department shall make the 157 participant facility registry available on the department's 158 website to any donor wishing to donate prescription cancer drugs or supplies to the program. The department's website shall also 159 160 contain links to prescription cancer drug manufacturers that offer drug assistance programs or free medication. 161

162 (11) Any donor of prescription cancer drugs or supplies, or any participant in the program, who exercises reasonable care 163 164 in donating, accepting, distributing, or dispensing prescription 165 cancer drugs or supplies under the program and the rules adopted 166 under this section shall be immune from civil or criminal 167 liability and from professional disciplinary action of any kind 168 for any injury, death, or loss to person or property relating to 169 such activities.

(12) A pharmaceutical manufacturer is not liable for any
claim or injury arising from the transfer of any prescription
cancer drug under this section, including, but not limited to,
liability for failure to transfer or communicate product or
consumer information regarding the transferred drug, as well as
the expiration date of the transferred drug.

If any conflict exists between the provisions in this
 section and the provisions in this chapter or chapter 465, the
 provisions in this section shall control the operation of the
 <u>Prescription</u> Cancer Drug Donation Program.
