80 (b) "Fireworks" does not include sparklers approved by the 81 division pursuant to s. 791.013; toy pistols, toy canes, toy 82 guns, or other devices in which paper caps containing twenty-83 five hundredths grains or less of explosive compound are used, providing they are so constructed that the hand cannot come in 84 contact with the cap when in place for the explosion; and toy 85 pistol paper caps which contain less than twenty hundredths 86 87 grains of explosive mixture, the sale and use of which shall be 88 permitted at all times.

89 (c) "Fireworks" also does not include the following90 novelties and trick noisemakers:

91 1. A snake or glow worm, which is a pressed pellet of not 92 more than 10 grams of pyrotechnic composition that produces a 93 large, snakelike ash which expands in length as the pellet burns 94 and that does not contain mercuric thiocyanate.

95 2. A smoke device, which is a tube or sphere containing 96 not more than 10 grams of pyrotechnic composition that, upon 97 burning, produces white or colored smoke as the primary effect.

3. A trick noisemaker, which is a device that produces a

of explosive compound, which is ignited by pulling the ends of
the string, and which produces a small report.

109 c. A snapper, which is a small, paper-wrapped device 110 containing not more than four milligrams of explosive 111 composition coated on small bits of sand, and which, when 112 dropped, explodes, producing a small report. A snapper may not 113 contain more than 250 milligrams of total sand and explosive 114 composition.

d. A trick match, which is a kitchen or book match which is coated with not more than 16 milligrams of explosive or pyrotechnic composition and which, upon ignition, produces a small report or shower of sparks.

e. A cigarette load, which is a small wooden peg that has
been coated with not more than 16 milligrams of explosive
composition and which produces, upon ignition of a cigarette
containing one of the pegs, a small report.

123 f. An auto burglar alarm, which is a tube which contains 124 not more than 10 grams of pyrotechnic composition that produces 125 a loud whistle or smoke when ignited and which is ignited by use

of a squib. A small quantity of explosive, not exceeding 50 126 127 milligrams, may also be used to produce a small report. 128 129 The sale and use of items listed in this paragraph are permitted 130 at all times. (5) "Manufacturer" means any person engaged in the 131 132 manufacture or construction of sparklers in this state. 133 (6) "Retailer" means any person who, at a fixed place of business, is engaged in selling sparklers to consumers at 134 135 retail. 136 (7) "Seasonal retailer" means any person engaged in the 137 business of selling sparklers at retail in this state from June 138 20 through July 5 and from December 10 through January 2 of each 139 year. 140 (4) (8) "Sparkler" means a device which emits showers of 141 sparks upon burning, does not contain any explosive compounds, 142 does not detonate or explode, is handheld or ground based, 143 cannot propel itself through the air, and contains not more than 144 100 grams of the chemical compound which produces sparks upon burning. 151 791.012 Minimum fireworks safety standards.-The outdoor 152 display of fireworks in this state shall be governed by the 153 National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1123, Code for 154 Fireworks Display, 1995 Edition, approved by the American 155 National Standards Institute. Any state, county, or municipal 156 law, rule, or ordinance may provide for more stringent regulations for the outdoor display of fireworks, but in no 157 158 event may any such law, rule, or ordinance provide for less stringent regulations for the outdoor display of fireworks. The 159 160 division shall promulgate rules to carry out the provisions of this section.
