13 (a) "Killing of a law enforcement officer who was acting 14 in accordance with his or her official duties" means all acts or 15 events that cause or otherwise relate to the death of a law 16 enforcement officer who was acting in accordance with his or her 17 official duties, including any related acts or events 18 immediately preceding or subsequent to the acts or events that 19 were the proximate cause of death.

20 (b) "Killing of a victim of a mass shooting" means all 21 acts or events that cause or otherwise relate to the death of a 22 person, not including the perpetrator, who is killed in an 23 incident in which three or more people, not including the 24 perpetrator, are killed by an intentional act of gun violence by 25 another person.

(c) "Killing of a victim of a school shooting" means all acts or events that cause or otherwise relate to the death of a person, not including the perpetrator, who is killed in an incident at a school by an intentional act of gun violence by another person, including any related acts or events immediately preceding or subsequent to the acts or events that were the proximate cause of death.

(2) A photograph or video or audio recording that depicts or records the killing of a law enforcement officer who was acting in accordance with his or her official duties, the killing of a victim of a school shooting, or the killing of a victim of a mass shooting is confidential and exempt from s.
