14	(1) <del>Beginning with the 2017-2018 school year,</del> The Early		
15	Childhood Music Education Incentive Pilot Program is created		
16	within the Department of Education for a period of 3 school		
17	<del>years</del> . The purpose of the pilot program is to assist selected		
18	school districts in implementing comprehensive music education		
19	programs for students in kindergarten through grade 2.		
20	(2) <del>In order for</del> A school district <u>is</u> <del>to be</del> eligible for

22	<u>certifies</u> <del>certify</del> to the Commissioner of Education, in a format

          (3) (a) The commissioner shall select school districts for
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    participation in the pilot program, subject to legislative
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    appropriation, based on the school district's proximity to the
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    University of Florida and needs-based criteria established by
    the State Board of Education. Selected school districts shall
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    annually receive $150 per full-time equivalent student in
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    kindergarten through grade 2 who is enrolled in a comprehensive
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    music education program.
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          (b) To maintain eligibility for participation in the pilot
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    program, a selected school district must annually certify to the
    commissioner, in a format prescribed by the department, that
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    each elementary school within the district provides a
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    comprehensive music education program that meets the
    requirements of subsection (2). If a selected school district
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    fails to provide the annual certification for a fiscal year, the
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    school district must return all funds received through the pilot
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    program for that fiscal year.
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          (4) The University of Florida's College of Education shall
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evaluate the effectiveness of the pilot program by measuring student academic performance and the success of the program. The evaluation must include, but is not limited to, a quantitative analysis of student achievement and a qualitative evaluation of students enrolled in the comprehensive music education programs. (5) The State Board of Education may adopt rules to
