51 564.09 Restaurants; off-premises consumption of wine.-52 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a restaurant 53 licensed to sell wine on the premises may permit a patron to remove one unsealed bottle of wine for consumption off the 54 55 premises if the patron has purchased a full course meal 56 consisting of a salad or vegetable, entree, a beverage, and 57 bread and consumed a portion of the bottle of wine with such 58 meal on the restaurant premises. A partially consumed bottle of wine that is to be removed from the premises must be securely 59 resealed by the licensee or its employees before removal from 60 the premises. The partially consumed bottle of wine shall be 61 placed in a bag or other container that is secured in such a 62 manner that it is visibly apparent if the container has been 63 301937

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64 subsequently opened or tampered with, and a dated receipt for 65 the bottle of wine and full course meal shall be provided by the 66 licensee and attached to the container. If transported in a 67 motor vehicle, the container with the resealed bottle of wine 68 must be placed in a locked glove compartment, a locked trunk, or 69 the area behind the last upright seat of a motor vehicle that is 70 not equipped with a trunk.

71 Section 5. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) and paragraph 72 (c) of subsection (2) of section 565.03, Florida Statutes, are 73 amended to read:

565.03 License fees; manufacturers, distributors, brokers,

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(1) As used in this section, the term:

(b) "Craft distillery" means a licensed distillery that has notified the division in writing of its decision to qualify as a craft distillery and that:

81 <u>1.</u> Produces <u>250,000</u> 75,000 or fewer gallons per calendar
82 year of distilled spirits on its premises; and

83 <u>2. Sells up to 50,000 gallons per calendar year of</u> 84 <u>distilled spirits to consumers at its souvenir gift shop in</u> 85 <u>accordance with this section</u> Has notified the division in 86 writing of its decision to qualify as a craft distillery.

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88 (c) A craft distillery licensed under this section may sell to consumers, at its souvenir gift shop, up to 50,000 89 90 gallons per calendar year of branded products distilled on its 91 premises in this state in factory-sealed containers that are 92 filled at the distillery for off-premises consumption. Such 93 sales are authorized only on private property contiguous to the 94 licensed distillery premises in this state and included on the 95 sketch or diagram defining the licensed premises submitted with the distillery's license application. All sketch or diagram 96 revisions by the distillery shall require the division's 97 approval verifying that the souvenir gift shop location operated 98 99 by the licensed distillery is owned or leased by the distillery and on property contiguous to the distillery's production 100 101 building in this state. 102 1. A craft distillery may not sell any factory-sealed

102 individual containers of spirits except in face-to-face sales 103 transactions with consumers who are making a purchase of no more 105 than six individual containers of each branded product.
