19	(c) Each judge of compensation claims shall be appointed						
20	for an initial a term of office of 6 4 years. $_{ au}$ A judge of						
21	compensation claims but during the term of office may be removed						
22	during his or her term of office by the Governor for cause.						
23	Prior to the expiration of a judge's term of office, the						
24	statewide nominating commission shall review the judge's conduct						
25	and determine whether the judge's performance is satisfactory.

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Effective July 1, 2002, In determining whether a judge's 26 27 performance is satisfactory, the commission shall consider the 28 extent to which the judge has met the requirements of this 29 chapter, including, but not limited to, the requirements of ss. 30 440.25(1) and (4)(a)-(e), 440.34(2), and 440.442. If the judge's performance is deemed satisfactory, the commission shall report 31 32 its finding to the Governor no later than 6 months prior to the 33 expiration of the judge's term of office. The Governor shall review the commission's report and may reappoint the judge for 34 35 an additional 4-year term. If the Governor does not reappoint the judge, the Governor shall inform the commission. The judge 36 37 shall remain in office until the Governor has appointed a 38 successor judge in accordance with paragraphs (a) and (b). If a 39 vacancy occurs during a judge's unexpired term, the statewide nominating commission does not find the judge's performance is 40 41 satisfactory, or the Governor does not reappoint the judge, the 42 Governor shall appoint a successor judge for a term of 6 4 years 43 in accordance with paragraph (b). 44 (6) Each full-time judge of compensation claims shall

45 receive an annual salary that is \$10,000 less than the annual 46 salary paid to a circuit court judge. The Deputy Chief Judge of 47 Compensation Claims shall receive an annual salary that is 48 \$1,000 more than the annual salary paid to a judge of 49 compensation claims. Salaries of judges of compensation claims 50 shall be paid from the Workers' Compensation Administration
