5 Section 14. Section 790.223, Florida Statutes, is created  
6 to read:

7 790.223 Microstamping of assault weapons.-

8 (1) As used in this section, the term:

9 (a)1. "Assault weapon" means any selective-fire firearm  
10 capable of fully automatic, semiautomatic or burst fire at the  
11 option of the user or any of the following specified

12 semiautomatic firearms:

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13 a. All AK series, including, but not limited to, the  
14 following: AK, AKM, AKS, AK-47, AK-74, ARM, MAK90, MISR, NHM90,  
15 NHM91, SA 85, SA 93, VEPR, WASR-10, WUM, Rock River Arms LAR-47,  
16 and Vector Arms AK-47.

17 b. All AR series, including, but not limited to, the  
18 following: AR-10, AR-15, Bushmaster XM15, Armalite AR-180 and  
19 M15, Olympic Arms, AR70, DPMS Tactical Rifles, Smith & Wesson  
20 M&P15 Rifles, Colt AR-15, Rock River Arms LAR-15, and DoubleStar  
21 AR rifles.

22 c. Algimec AGM1.

23 d. Barrett 82A1 and REC7.

24 e. Beretta AR-70 and Beretta Storm.

25 f. Bushmaster Auto Rifle.

96 into an assault weapon or any combination of parts from which an

99 5. Any semiautomatic firearm not listed in subparagraphs  
100 1.-4. that meets the following criteria:

101 a. A semiautomatic rifle that has an ability to accept a  
102 detachable magazine and has one or more of the following:

103 (I) A folding or telescoping stock;

104 (II) A pistol grip that protrudes conspicuously beneath  
105 the action of the weapon or any feature functioning as a  
106 protruding grip that can be held by the non-trigger hand or a  
107 thumbhole stock;

108 (III) A bayonet mount;

109 (IV) A flash suppressor or threaded barrel designed to  
110 accommodate a flash suppressor;

111 (V) A grenade launcher;

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112 (VI) A shroud attached to the barrel, or that partially or  
113 completely encircles the barrel allowing the bearer to hold the  
114 firearm with the non-trigger hand without being burned, but  
115 excluding a slide that encloses the barrel; or

116 b. A semiautomatic pistol that has an ability to accept a  
117 detachable magazine and has one or more of the following:

118 (I) The capacity to accept an ammunition magazine that  
119 attaches to the pistol at any location outside of the pistol  
120 grip;

121 (II) A threaded barrel capable of accepting a barrel  
122 extender, flash suppressor, forward handgrip, or silencer;

123 (III) A slide that encloses the barrel and that permits  
124 the shooter to hold the firearm with the non-trigger hand  
125 without being burned;

126 (IV) A manufactured weight of 50 ounces or more when the  
127 pistol is unloaded;

128 (V) A semiautomatic version of an automatic firearm;

129 (VI) Any feature capable of functioning as a protruding  
130 grip that can be held by the non-trigger hand;

131 (VII) A folding, telescoping, or thumbhole stock; or

132 c. A semiautomatic shotgun that has one or more of the  
133 following:

134 (I) A folding or telescoping stock;

135 (II) A pistol grip that protrudes conspicuously beneath  
136 the action of the weapon;

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137 (III) A thumbhole stock;

138 (IV) A fixed magazine capacity in excess of 5 rounds;

139 (V) An ability to accept a detachable magazine; or

140 d. Any semiautomatic pistol or any semiautomatic,  
141 centerfire, or rimfire rifle with a fixed magazine that has the  
142 capacity to accept more than 10 rounds of ammunition; or

143 e. A part or combination of parts designed or intended to  
144 convert a firearm into an assault weapon or any combination of  
145 parts from which an assault weapon may be assembled if those  
146 parts are in the possession or under the control of the same  
147 person.

148 (b) "Detachable magazine" means an ammunition feeding  
149 device that can be removed from a firearm without disassembly of  
150 the firearm action.

151 (c) "Fixed magazine" means an ammunition feeding device  
152 contained in, or permanently attached to, a firearm in such a  
153 manner that the device cannot be removed without disassembly of  
154 the firearm action.

155 (2) Any assault weapon sold in this state after January 1,  
156 2019, shall be designed and equipped with a microscopic array of  
157 characters that identify the make, model, and serial number of  
158 the assault weapon, etched or otherwise imprinted in two or more  
159 places on the interior surface or internal working parts of the  
160 assault weapon, and that are transferred by imprinting on each  
161 cartridge case when the weapon is fired, provided that the

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162 Department of Law Enforcement certifies that the technology used  
163 to create the imprint is available to more than one manufacturer  
164 unencumbered by any patent restrictions. The Executive Director  
165 of the Department of Law Enforcement may also approve a method  
166 of equal or greater reliability and effectiveness in identifying  
167 the specific serial number of a firearm from spent cartridge  
168 casings discharged by that firearm than that in this subsection,  
169 to be thereafter required as otherwise set forth by this  
170 subsection if the executive director certifies that this new  
171 method is also unencumbered by any patent restrictions. Approval  
172 by the executive director shall include notice of that fact  
173 through rules promulgated by the department.
