For the 2017-2018 school year, students enrolled in Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School are exempt from taking the statewide standardized assessments administered pursuant to s. 1008.22, Florida Statutes, and the use of assessment results for course grades pursuant to s. 1003.4282, Florida Statutes; however, the school shall administer industry Florida Senate - 2018 Bill No. CS for HB 7055



12	certification assessments, national assessments, and statewide
13	standardized assessments for any student who chooses to take the
14	assessment. Students who are in the 2017-2018 graduating class
15	are exempt from the minimum hours of instruction requirement of

18	pursuant to s. 1003.4282, Florida Statutes, and to earn standard
