A bill to be entitled

An act relating to judicial nominating commissions; amending s. 43.291, F.S.; revising the procedures for appointing members to judicial nominating commissions; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) and subsection (3) of section 43.291, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
 43.291 Judicial nominating commissions.—
- (1) Each judicial nominating commission shall be composed of the following members:
- (a) Four members of The Florida Bar, appointed by the Governor, who are engaged in the practice of law, each of whom is a resident of the territorial jurisdiction served by the commission to which the member is appointed. The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives The Board of Covernors of The Florida Bar shall each appoint two members to fill positions as they expire or are vacated. For each position:
- 1. The Board of Governors of The Florida Bar shall recommend three qualified individuals for appointment to the position.
 - 2. The President of the Senate or the Speaker of the House

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of Representatives, as appropriate, shall publish a list of qualified individuals under consideration for appointment that includes the recommendations of the Board of Governors of The Florida Bar.

- 3. The President of the Senate or the Speaker of the House of Representatives, as appropriate, shall accept comments on the individuals on the list and shall wait at least 30 days after publication of the list before making the appointment submit to the Governor three recommended nominees for each position. The Governor shall select the appointee from the list of nominees recommended for that position, but the Governor may reject all of the nominees recommended for a position and request that the Board of Governors submit a new list of three different recommended nominees for that position who have not been previously recommended by the Board of Governors.
- (3) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, each current member of a judicial nominating commission appointed directly by the Board of Governors of The Florida Bar shall serve the remainder of his or her term, unless removed for cause. For each position previously held by a member nominated by the Board of Governors of The Florida Bar, the replacement at the end of the term shall be as follows:
- (a) For appointments to the Supreme Court Judicial

 Nominating Commission, the President of the Senate shall appoint
 the members for the first and third vacant positions and the

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Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint the members for the second and fourth vacant positions.

- (b) For appointments to the other judicial nominating commissions:
- 1. For each even-numbered district court or circuit court, the President of the Senate shall appoint the members for the first and third vacant positions and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint the members for the second and fourth vacant positions.
- 2. For each odd-numbered district court or circuit court, the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint the members for the first and third vacant positions and the President of the Senate shall appoint the members for the second and fourth vacant positions. The terms of all other members of a judicial nominating commission are hereby terminated, and the Governor shall appoint new members to each judicial nominating commission in the following manner:
- (a) Two appointments for terms ending July 1, 2002, one of which shall be an appointment selected from nominations submitted by the Board of Governors of The Florida Bar pursuant to paragraph (1)(a);
 - (b) Two appointments for terms ending July 1, 2003; and
 - (c) Two appointments for terms ending July 1, 2004.

Every subsequent appointment, except an appointment to fill a

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vacant, unexpired term, shall be for 4 years. Each expired term or vacancy shall be filled by appointment in the same manner as the member whose position is being filled.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect January 8, 2019.

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
