A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Bollards Grant Program; creating s. 316.0899, F.S.; requiring the Department of Transportation to develop the Bollards Grant Program in order to provide grants to municipalities and counties for the installation of bollards in their jurisdictions; defining the term "bollard"; requiring a county or municipality to specify in its application the area, which may include private property, where it intends to install bollards and why the installation is needed; requiring the department to accept applications and award grants each year; requiring the department to develop a plan to promote the program; requiring the department to adopt rules to establish application and selection criteria, subject to certain requirements; requiring the department to submit the grant program guidelines and the plan for promoting the program to the Governor and Legislature by a specified date; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 316.0899, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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316.0899 Bollards Grant Program.

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(1) The Department of Transportation shall develop the

Bollards Grant Program in order to provide grants to

municipalities and counties for the installation of bollards in

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their jurisdictions.

(2) For purposes of this section, the term "bollard" means a post constructed to barricade an area to prevent motorized vehicular traffic in the area.

- (3) (a) A municipality or county must specify in its application the area, which may include private property, where it intends to install bollards and why the installation is needed. The department must accept applications and award grants each year if funds are available pursuant to subsection (5).
- (b) The department shall develop a plan to promote the program and adopt rules to establish the application and selection criteria for the awarding of the grants. The selection criteria must consider safety factors, including, but not limited to, the number of vehicle collisions with a pedestrian or structure occurring in the proposed areas, the population of senior citizens in or near such areas, and the amount of use by the public, particularly by senior citizens, such areas experience.
- (4) On or before January 1, 2019, the department shall submit the grant program guidelines and the plan for promoting the program to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- (5) For the 2018-2019 fiscal year, the sum of \$250,000 in nonrecurring funds is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Transportation to fund the grants awarded under this section. Thereafter, the Legislature may appropriate money each year to continue the program.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2018.
