Section 1003.457, Florida Statutes, is created 19 to read: 20 1003.457 Instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation.-21 (1) Each school district shall provide instruction in 22 cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and the use of an automated 23 external defibrillator. Students shall study and practice the psychomotor skills associated with performing CPR at least once 24 25 before graduating from high school. The instruction shall be a

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26 part of the physical education curriculum or another required 27 curriculum selected by the school district. 28 The instruction shall be based on an instructional (2) 29 program established by: 30 (a) The American Heart Association; 31 (b) The American Red Cross; or 32 (c) Another nationally recognized program that uses the 33 most current evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care 34 guidelines. 35 (3) A student with a disability, as defined in s. 1007.02, 36 is exempt from the requirements of this section. 37 Section 2. Subsection (3) of section 1003.453, Florida 38 Statutes, is amended to read: 39 1003.453 School wellness and physical education policies; 40 nutrition guidelines.-School districts are encouraged to provide basic 41 (3) 42 training in first aid, including cardiopulmonary resuscitation, for all students, beginning in grade 6 and every 2 years 43 thereafter. Private and public partnerships for providing 44 45 training or necessary funding are encouraged. 46 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2018.

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
