12	of section 409.175, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

16	(5)(a) The department shall adopt and amend licensing rules
17	for family foster homes, residential child-caring agencies, and
18	child-placing agencies. The department may also adopt rules
19	relating to the screening requirements for summer day camps and
20	summer 24-hour camps. The requirements for licensure and
21	operation of family foster homes, residential child-caring
22	agencies, and child-placing agencies shall include:
23	1. The operation, conduct, and maintenance of these homes
24	and agencies and the responsibility which they assume for
25	children served and the evidence of need for that service.
26	2. The provision of food, clothing, educational
27	opportunities, services, equipment, and individual supplies to
28	assure the healthy physical, emotional, and mental development
