The department 34 shall ensure that grants are awarded to applicants in various regions of the state In addition to the grants awarded under 35 36 subsections (1) and (2), up to 20 percent of the funding for the 37 Reducing Racial and Ethnic Health Disparities: Closing the Gap 38 grant program shall be dedicated to projects that address 39 improving racial and ethnic health status within specific Front Porch Florida Communities. 40
